## Dinner Dance Held By Corning Knights

Corning—Atty. Joseph J. Nasser of Corning speaking at the annual Corning Council, Knights of Columbus, Columbus Day dinner dance said of the day, "We can call it another Thanksgiving Day."

He explained: "I feel that perhaps we meet to pay Columbus honor actually in the sense of thanksgiving to him and to God who guided his way for discovering a land that we and our parents and our forefathers have prospered and found peace and happiness in."

Toastmaster was James P. Hallahan, The Rev. Thomas Watta of St. Mary's parish offered the invocation and the Rev. Theophanes Murphy, S.A. of Montour Falls, council chaplain, gave the benediction.

Grand Knight James Bothe and T. V. Hanley were co-chairmen.

Nasser said, "Columbus had the determination, the will, the faith and trust in God that he would succeed."

"When he landed one of his first acts was to plant the cross of Christ on the land. And it seems that upon so doing, he dedicated this land to Christianity, for including Canada on the north through South America, Christianity has been the dominant religious belief."

"That determination of Columbus set the pattern for us here."

Nasser said that from this land has come many inventions, which include the telephone, airplane, submarine, automobile

and electric light.

He said, "I often stop to wonder why these weren't invented long before Columbus discovered America."

"And the answer always seems to come back—God chose this land to be a showpiece for the world to show how peoples from all nationalities and all Christian religions can live side by side, work side by side and have love and respect for each other."

"And in so doing—He wants to show the world how He showers down His blessings upon them."

"Freedom under God—life, liberty and pursuit of happiness—are ingrained into each one of us and soon become ingrained into anyone lucky enough to migrate to our shores."
