

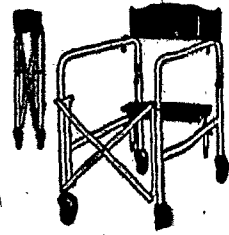
500 Auburn Teenagers Observe Youth Week

Ukrainian Rite Pastor Retires

The Very Rev. Waldimir B. Dowhovich, pastor of St. Nicholas Ukrainian Catholic Church in Elmira Heights will retire from active duty effective on Sunday.

He has been a priest 22 years. Father Dowhovich will be succeeded by the Rev. Michael J. Nyachyshyn, who now is pastor of St. Vladimir Church in Stamford, Conn.

A testimonial dinner and tribute have been arranged for Sunday afternoon at 4:30 in the church hall.

The affair is being sponsored by the Mothers Club and assisted by the Ladies Auxiliary of the church.

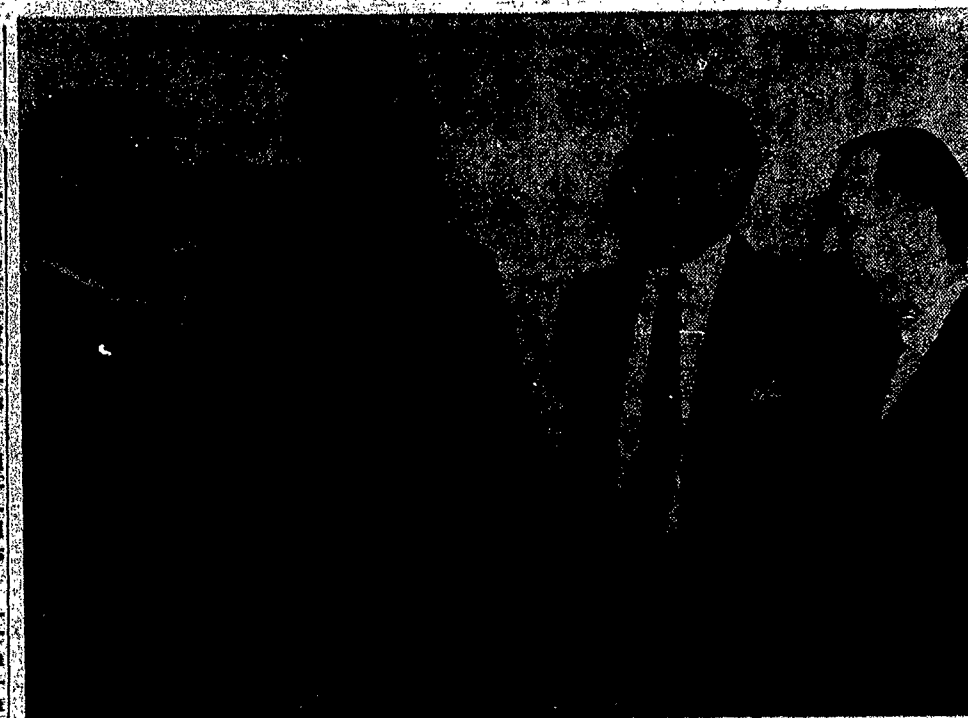

Doctors, Technicians Hear Father Egan

About fifty-five doctors, dentists, laboratory, X-ray, physical therapy, pharmacy and ambulance service personnel assisted at the third annual Communion and Breakfast of the Catholic Physicians' Guild, Elmira Area on Sunday, Oct. 25.

The Mass was offered at 9 a.m. in the Little Flower Chapel of the Dunn Memorial Nurses' Residence, St. Joseph's Hospital by the Rev. Joseph M. Egan, Professor of Theology, St. Bernard's Seminary.

THE REV. PHILIP E. MCGHAN, hospital chaplain and moderator of the group and the Rev. Michael Hynes, chaplain of the Dominican Monastery were in the sanctuary.

Robert Erway and John Brewer were acolytes. The Sisters' Choir sang during the Mass.

Immediately following the Mass, the group enjoyed a Communion Breakfast in the Nurses' Dining Room.

Father Egan was the guest speaker at the breakfast. Father McGhan and Father Hynes were seated at the speakers' table. Dr. James A. Mark, president of the Guild presided at the breakfast.

Father Egan said in part: "You physicians and those of the allied professions here this morning have been given talents not for yourselves primarily but rather to benefit other men. You are doing Christ's work. In his Public Life, Christ was concerned not only with the souls of men but with their bodies as well."

"Realize that you are children of God obliged to live by God's Commandments not only in your personal lives but in your professional lives as well," Father Egan concluded.

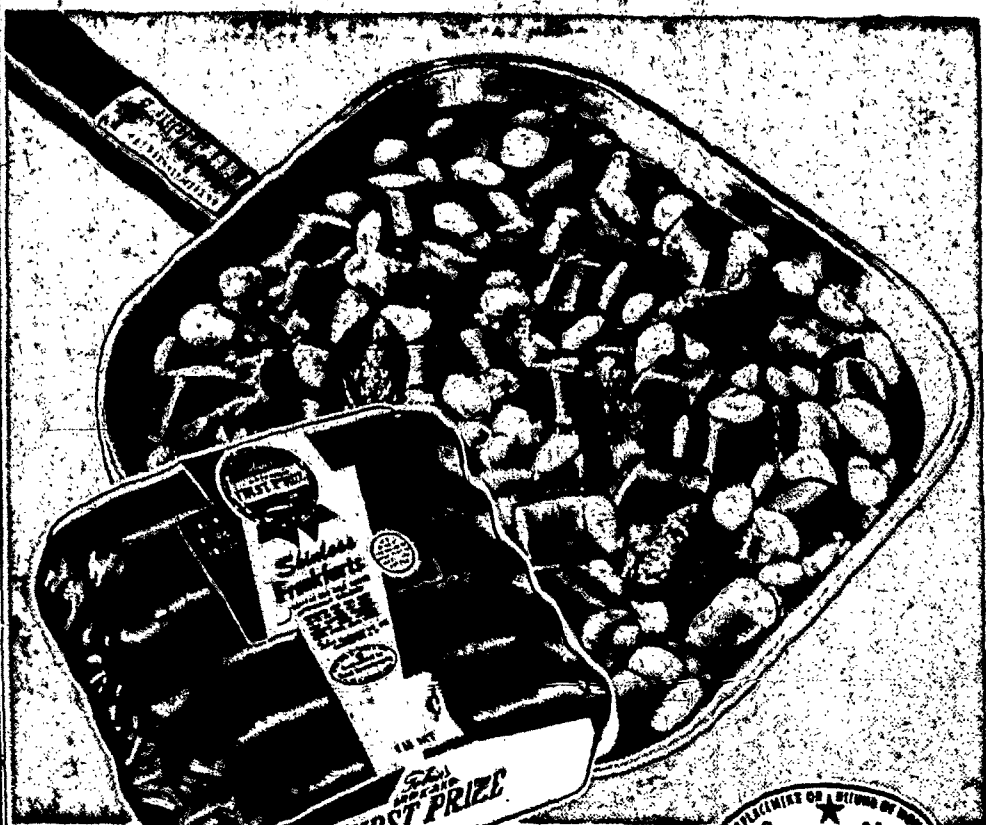
