Atlantic City — (RNS) — A six-year old Jehovah's Witness girl whose parents refused to allow her to receive a blood transfusion on religious grounds, died here after an emergency operation. The girl had suffered a de-Friday October 30, 1959 pressed compound fracture of



the skull when she was struck an automobile. Her parents, r. and Mrs. Joseph Yorinko of pearby Absecon Highlands, told hysicians they could not perthe transfusion because i would be the equivalent of "eating" blood, and this is forbidden in the Bible.

Dr. Harry Subin, chief of surgery at Atlantic City Hospital, said before the operation that "we all feel we're going in INGER ALE with one hand tied behind our backs, because in case of further loss of blood or shock we LUB SODA have little recourse."


The hospital earlier lost an ASSORTED attempt to get a court order POPULAR which would have allowed it to give the transfusion. County FLAVORS Judge George T. Namme said he lacked authority to issue such an order because he believed the parents were sincere in their religious beliefs.




