

## Requiem Masses Offered For Two St. Joseph Nuns

Two Sisters of St. Joseph, one who distinguished herself as a teacher and the other as a nursing supervisor died this week. Funeral Masses were conducted in Nazareth Convent, Pittsford.

Sister Mary Ita Lenehan, 75, a teacher for 56 years in the Diocese of Rochester died Oct. 23, 1959 in St. Mary's Hospital, Rochester. Sister Francis Xavier Dailor for many years a nursing supervisor at St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira died Monday, Oct. 26, 1959 at St. Joseph's. She had been hospitalized since last June.

The Solemn Requiem Mass for Sister Francis Xavier was celebrated by the Rev. Raymond M. Nolan with the Rt. Rev. Msgr. John M. Duffy, deacon; the Rev. Raymond Ringwood, subdeacon; Rev. Albert H. Schnacky, master of ceremonies and the Rev.

John P. Duffy and Rev. Richard Hart, acolytes.

Also present were the Right Reverend Monsignors Louis Edelman and Edward K. Ball and the Reverend Fathers E. Joseph Esser and John L. Maxwell.

A NATIVE OF Manchester, N.Y. Sister Francis Xavier was graduated from St. Joseph's School of Nursing in 1915. Sister spent the next four years in private nursing duty at Rochester before entering the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph at Rochester.

In 1922 after completing her novitiate, she was assigned to St. Joseph's in Elmira as a member of the nursing staff. From that time until 1944 she served on a nursing supervisory staff in both medical and surgical divisions of the hospital.

Sister Francis Xavier was assigned in 1944 to the Good Samaritan Hospital in Selma, Ala., a mission hospital operated by the Sisters of St. Joseph.

Since 1946 she had been assigned to the Motherhouse in Rochester.

Sister is survived by two brothers, William and Emmett Dailor of Stanley and three sisters, Mrs. Carrie McWilliams of Canandaigua, Mrs. Clara Moran of Geneva and Mrs. Frances Sullivan of Stanley.

**SISTER MARY ITA**, a native of Ireland, entered the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph in 1903. For the last nine years she had taught at Holy Rosary School and for eight years before that, at Blessed Sacrament.

From 1936 to 1942, Sister Mary Ita served as principal and eighth grade teacher at St. Patrick School, Mt. Morris. For 20 years before that she taught at St. Mary's School, Elmira. She had also taught at St. Patrick School, Seneca Falls and St. Mary's, Auburn.

Blessings at the graves in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery were given for Sister Mary Ita on Tuesday and Sister Francis Xavier on Wednesday.
