Songsters

"Presenting the Songsters" on Top Rank International is an album which every Rochesterian should want. The Songsters, formerly the Gentlemen Songsters, is an organization of singers which originated about twelve years ago from members of the Inter-High choir. The talented group of young men, then directed by Jerry Mack, performed on stage and in banquet halls, on stage and in concert both in and around Rochester. Later the young ladies were added to the group and a more well-rounded repertoire was possible.

NOW UNDER the direction of Paul Allen, this versatile group is making quite a splash around town. The latest endeavor is this excellent recording. With a velvety blend of voices, sharp diction and lots of spirit the Songsters bounce their way through top-dandy

favorites. Some of the selections which deserve note are: "Whistle A Happy Tune," "Get Me To The Church On Time," "September Song," and "Hi-Lili Hi Lo."

The only objection to the album is the use of stock arrangements. Here's a group which can out-waring, Fred Waring. They should write their own original arrangements.

"Aphrodite" by Jackie Gleason on Capitol. The ancient Greeks believed that the goddess Aphrodite stepped out of the ocean foam and started this thing, and "Love" Jackie Gleason thought that the name of the goddess would be a perfect name for an album and feeling that certain colors express certain emotions, Jackie has keyed many of these selections to hues of love such as "Blue Crystal," "Pastel Flame," "Violet Mist," and "Orange Velvet."

In these lush and beautiful compositions Gleason combines two full string orchestras with organ. This album will be a real treat for hi-fi and stereo fans.

BROOK BENTON on Mercury has recorded one which is skyrocketing on the charts. It is called "So Many Ways." Brook Benton who sort of copies the style of Nat King Cole does a fine job of just plain good singing. The record contains a full orchestra, a large chorus plus an excellent melody. It's too bad the guitar, piano and drums with the over-the-top plunkety-plunkety couldn't have been left out altogether.

Here's something different. "Everytime I Feel The Spirit" by Nat King Cole on Capitol. Nat sings spiritual with the First Church of Deliverance Choir of Chicago and together they've created a glorious Hebrew sound. Some of the old favorites on the album are "Go Down, Moses," "Nobody Knows The Trouble I've Seen," and "Steal Away."

FOR THOSE who like to travel to far away places for \$4.95 here's the ticket of the week. "The Lure Of The Mediterranean" by Axel Stordahl on Decca. The album comes equipped with a portfolio of colored pictures of Casablanca, Algiers, the Casbah, Cyprus, Sicily, the Riviera and almost all ports on the Mediterranean. Also included in the record folder is a verbal travelogue by Horace Vernal describing the various areas around the Mediterranean.

Conductor - arranged Axel Stordahl presents a new and magnificent medley of instrumental music. Stordahl achieves some exciting orchestral color. With a little imagination one could transport oneself easily to an easy chair at the "playground of the world."

For jazz lovers, here's a tip. "The Piano Scene of Ahmad Jamal" on Epic. In the album pianist Jamal sees no point in just constructing a solo by to-boggling through the chords of a revealing technique for the jazz scene. He plays as if he knew how important a part of music silence can be if you make it work for you. Jamal is rapidly becoming a major force in the jazz scene.

Cranes are Flying
Observation: This is the first of seven Russian films which are to be exhibited in this country as a consequence of the cultural exchange arranged between the government of the United States of America and of the USSR.

Class B
Solomon and Sheba
Observation: This film is a completely fictional account of a great percentage of the Old Testament. Under the guise of religious drama it attempts to tell a story of spiritual regeneration. These thematic values, however, are nullified by the treatment which resorts to excessive sensuality in costuming, dancing and situations. As an entertainment in a 2 1/2 spectacle, but a 2 1/2 marketed particularly for the patronage of the Christmas season, this film seriously offends the Judeo-Christian concept of modesty and decency.

Red Film Gets A-3 Rating

New York - (NC) - The National Legion of Decency has announced that it has evaluated the Russian-made movie "The Cranes Are Flying" in Class A, Section 3, morally unobjectionable for adults.

This is the first of seven Soviet films which will be shown in this country in an exchange program under which U.S. made movies will be shown in the Soviet Union. The first U.S. made movie to be shown in Russia under the program is the Academy Award winning "Marty," which was rated Class A, Section 2, morally unobjectionable for adults.

The legion also announced it had evaluated the United Artists movie "Solomon and Sheba" in Class B, morally objectionable in part for all.

EMMETT L. DOYLE
for CITY COURT JUDGE
A native of Rochester, Doyle has one of those rare and valuable natures which ploughs the job to be done, then goes on to meet the next challenge.
Since 1942, he has been a partner in the law firm of Nier & Doyle, which he joined after serving two years as assistant industrial commissioner in the State labor department for the Rochester area. He also served as a referee for the Workmen's Compensation Board and as an arbitrator in labor matters, and in both posts exhibited the maturity and integrity of the judicial mind together with the inventiveness of the skilled observer of human nature.
As a member of the New York State Senate in the late 1930's Emmett Doyle was the proud sponsor of the "Little Wagner Act"—the state statute which guaranteed for the first time within the state the working man's right to organize and bargain collectively.
Before winning his state senate seat, Doyle served as the majority leader of the Monroe County Board of Supervisors. In that post and as Supervisor of the 18th Ward, Emmett Doyle vigorously kept the Democratic tradition of making needed innovations.
Doyle, a graduate of East High School and the University of Buffalo Law School, also was active for several years in law editorial work for Lawyers Cooperative Publishing Co.
A member of many local civic clubs, Doyle is past president of the Northeast Kiwanis Club and the Locust Hill Country Club. He is a member of the 18th Ward Businessmen's Association and the Knights of Columbus.
