Requiem Held

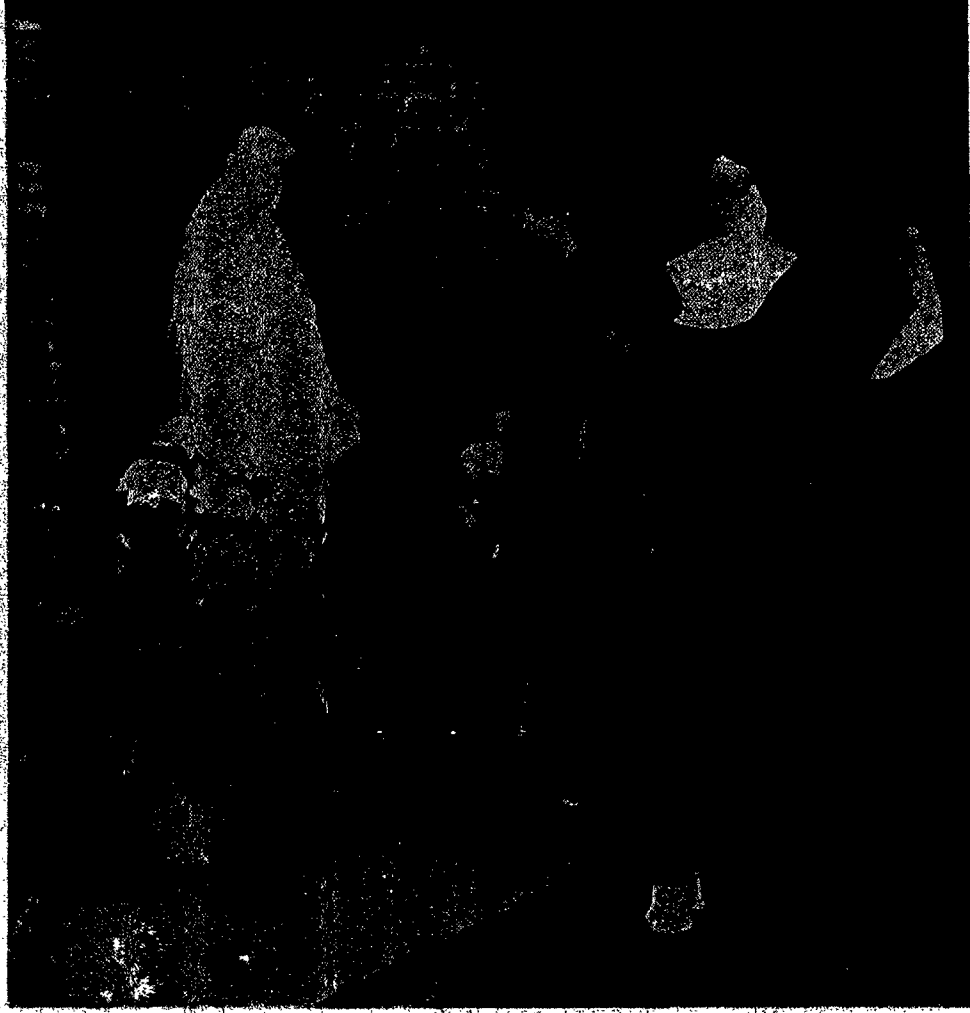
Funeral Mass for Joseph C. Fox was celebrated in St. Andrew's Church, Rochester on Tuesday, Oct. 20.

Famed Author, Fr. Vann
To Lecture At Fisher

Rev. Gerald Vann, O.P., noted Dominican scholar and lecturer from Blackfriars, Oxford, England, will give two addresses at St. John Fisher College, Wednesday, Nov. 4.

A native of Kent, England, Father Vann did his advanced studies in philosophy and theology at the Angelicum in Rome and later at Oxford. He is widely known in England for his lectures and his series of broadcasts on the B.B.C.


HE IS THE author of many books dealing with the subjects of philosophy, psychology and education. Among his recent books are The Divine Pilgrimage, The Water and the Fire, The High Green Hill and The Paradise Tree.

Father Vann is completing an extensive lecture tour of this country and is making a special trip to St. John Fisher College, which he visited on a previous trip to America.

Father Vann will speak to the faculty and students of the college in the afternoon. His subject will be "Michelangelo and the Beatniks."

His public address in the evening will be given in the Rostin Keane Auditorium at 8:15. This public is invited. There is no admission charge.
