Philippine Doctor Meets Missioner From Homeland

N.Y., Sister Camille Marie atnan) a sister of Sister St. Dorothy (Keenan) of Nazareth Academy in Rochester.

A happy and unexpected event was brought about last Friday at St. Joseph's Hospital in Elmira.

So, Sister Camille Marie will once again leave her home for distant fields in Mission work country as Dr. Esther Pura remains here to continue her studies in Medicine—10,000 miles from her home.

Sister Camille Marie, R.N., a Maryknoll Missionary Sister, visited her alma mater and met Dr. Esther Pura, an intern from the Philippines.

FOLLOWING HER graduation as a Nurse in 1945 she entered the Maryknoll Motherhouse at Ossining, N.Y., where she completed her training in the field. The Order is formally known as the Maryknoll Sisters of St. Dominic.

Sister looks forward to her Mission in Guadalupe City, for as she stated, "there is so much to be done to alleviate the physical disabilities of the people and make my contribution to their spiritual welfare."

BOTH ARE determined to give their lives to the needs of their fellow humans—the one in Religion and the Art of Nursing and the other through her Medical skill—for the greater honor and glory of God.

The good Sister and the Doctor enjoyed a long chat in the Visayan dialect, spoken in Bacolod City area, home of Dr. Pura. The hospital where Sister serves is twice as general duty and later in the operating room is owned and maintained by the Victorias Milling Co. but is staffed by 20 Maryknoll Sisters including a pharmacist, a laboratory technician, nurses and aides.

While in Elmira, Sister Camille Marie had an opportunity to visit her own sister, Mrs. Francis G. (Virginia) Treat, who is a 1947 graduate of St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing.

There the Sisters train the Nurses and Aides not only in the Art of Nursing but in intellectual work as well, so that they in turn can teach religion in the public schools or released time to over 1000 Catholic children.
