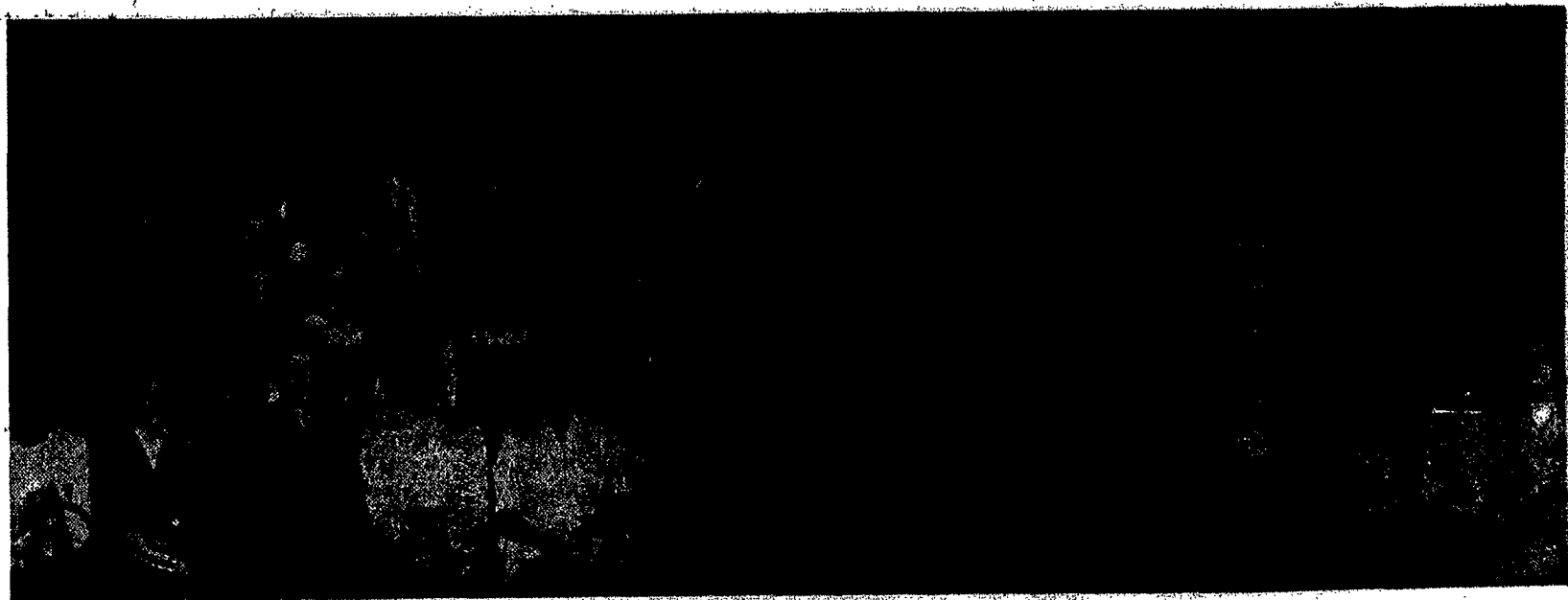
At 10:45 a.m., there will be a ceremony at the plaque at the Rindel Memorial Library under the chairmanship of Post County Commander Francis S. Petlick.
