**Women's College Bills Author Cecily Hastings**

"Religion Under The Open Sky" is the topic on which Miss Cecily Hastings will speak at Nazareth College, on Thursday, Nov. 19, at 10:30 a.m.

Miss Hastings, as a member of the English Catholic Evidence Guild, calls on personal experience when she describes what street-corner speaking teaches us about the religious need and difficulties of the average man.

For over a decade Miss Hastings has been an outstanding speaker for the Guild, the purpose of which is to explain Catholic dogma and practice to street-corner crowds. Frank Shred has said of her that he has never heard a better lecturer.

MISS HASTINGS, who is also well known in England as a platform and television lecturer, was born in Italy of a distinguished English family. After taking her degree at Oxford in Modern Languages, she began her literary career as a translator.

Her own first book, Catholic Evidence Questions and Answers, had a notable success, and she carries on her writing at the present time, as a contributor to Catholic publications.

In the United States, Miss Hastings has served as the British Vice-Consul in New York, and has been associated with the New York Gaelic Society and the American Gaelic Society.
