Bishop Casey Slated For Kickoff Dinner

Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey will address more than 200 men of St. Boniface parish at the kickoff dinner for commitment in the new St. Boniface Church Appeal. The dinner will be served in the school hall.

Three-year pledges, with a minimum goal of \$200,000; will be sought in a parish-wide campaign from 2 to 4 p.m. Sunday, Nov. 18, at the new building, new Gregory Street church being constructed on the site of the former fire-razed edifice.

The Rev. Francis J. Taylor, pastor, announced that occupancy of the church is expected early next year. Since the disastrous fire just two years ago, parishioners have attended services in the remodeled school auditorium.

POINTING OUT that there is an estimated projected cost of \$200,000 for the new church, Father Taylor told the parishioners that this would be a prohibitive debt burden, and that it necessitates an immediate campaign to reduce the amount to be borrowed and the interest payments thereon.

The new church, which will seat 700 persons, is of modern Gothic architecture. It will be attached to the rectory, and will be air-conditioned. Above the main entrance will be a stained-glass window, and above the main altar a large mural of St. Boniface.

The sanctuary and altar will be in marble. On the left side of the main altar will be the baptistry, and on the right the stairway to the choir loft. In the basement will be a large all-purpose room, to be used principally as a nursery, where Sodality girls will take care of small children during services.
