Theatre News

Another Barrymore

CURTAINS UP reveals that where they discuss their troubles and their centeries left the Barrymore out of her name, has not lost the Barrymore charm. Her smile seems no superficial expression but an illumination from her inner self; her mother's rich speaking voice is now a singing voice of liquid tones and easy strength.

Miss Colt calls her one woman show "A Love Letter to the American Musical Theatre." She has chosen thirteen songs of different periods between 1787-1959 and sings them in costume as dramatic monologues. The most successful are a girl from the FLORADORA sextette; selections from Stephen Foster; TEA FOR TWO in 1920 and a Torch song of the '30's.

DEIDRE OF THE SORROWS is the first production in this country of Spenser's play about the legendary beings of Ireland. Deidre is played with dignity and spirit by a girl with the curious name of Saleme Jens and the whole production is of unusually high calibre.

POSSESSION is a psychopathic sense in the taking over of a living person's body by an evil spirit. It is recognized by the Catholic Church with a special rite of exorcism. In an Irish play, THE RIGHTEOUS ARE BOLD, which had a long run in Dublin a priest, as exorcist, saves a young girl but dies himself. A few in the audience knew what "possession" meant but in Jewish folk lore the dybbuk — the spirit which steals another person's body — is well known.

In fact THE DYBBUK is the title of Yiddish classic. In THE TENTH MAN, Paddy Chayevsky had therof an old tradition on which to build his comedy drama which takes place in a dilapidated little synagogue in Mineola, Long Island.

A NEW TREND in the LE department is to release the big singles of past years. Decca has just released a very large package consisting of six 12 inch albums containing all the really big hits from the past thirty years. The name of the series is "The Late Thirties," "The Late Forties," "The Middle Forties," "The Late Fifties," "The Late Sixties."

Deca's first big record was a thing called "The Music Goes Round And Around" played by the Elley-Firely Orchestra and was released in the mid-thirties. Decca has had many hits since then. This collection is interesting not only for nostalgic reasons but it charts the musical pulse of a nation from the thirties to the present. More and more record companies will be doing this in the future and it's a worthwhile endeavor.

Here's one that will make you sit up and take notice. "Up On the Bunny Squirrel" on Fantasy label. This is one of those speed-up the tape and distort the voice type of things similar to the Chipmunks on Liberty.

The strange thing is that this song, arrangement and all is an excellent piece of music. It is jazzy and has that "big band" sound. The singers, the Nutty Squirrels, with a scat type of singing sound like elfin couples of the Four Freshmen, The Blue Stars or the Hillis's.

"ONLY YOU, ONLY ME" by Jackie Wilson on Brunswick is a rocker that almost fools you. The melody is fairly musical, strings are added to take the sting off things and a chorus chimes in and sings — really sings instead of shouts. Outside of a hiccupping style of singing, Jackie Wilson does a nice job with the melody. The other side of the record, "Talk That Talk," is another cheap, raucous, do-nothing, go nowhere rocker.
