Sibley's Displays Gigantic Santa

The most gigantic Santa and reindeer display ever built for what will dominate the downtown scene this Christmas season on Sibley's breathtaking Main Street store front.
Eight super-size reindeer, 16 feet long and 10 feet high, pull a traditional 16 foot long sleigh which Santa sits 15 feet tall. The entire display covers 300 feet of store front and the top of Santa's head stands 60 feet above street level.
Subtle illumination and strings of hundreds of lights illuminate a series of seven alcoves, each 22 feet square, in both by day and night.

Armenians in Athens

35 Years To Find Home

Athens — (NC) — The joint efforts of the Catholic Church and the United States have resulted in new homes for 30 Armenian refugees in their homeland 35 years ago.

Completion of the apartment building in suburban Doukissini district a project begun a quarter-century ago by the Ordinarie for Armenian Rite Catholics in Greece. The dedication served to recall the massacres and starvation of hundreds of thousands of Armenians in the era of World War I.
Presiding at the dedication ceremony was retired Bishop Cyrille Zohrabian, O.F.M. Cap. who served as Ordinary for Armenian Rite Catholics in Greece from 1925 until 1930. The dedication was preceded by a Mass offered by Bishop Zohrabian.
Among those present was Dr. V. Beermann, representative in Greece of the U.N. High Commissioner for Refugees, and Mrs. Mary Ballou, local representative of Catholic Relief Service — National Catholic Welfare Conference, the American Bishops' overseas charities agency.
The U.N. Refugee Fund provided \$30,000 toward construction of the apartment building — \$9,000 as a grant and \$21,000 as a loan. Catholic Relief Service — NCWC donated \$10,000, and the remainder of the cost was borne by the Armenian Catholic Ordinarie.
The modern apartment building was created at the center of the Armenian Catholic community in Dourghouti, on a large tract of land owned by the Ordinarie. Across the street are the Illuminarie, the residence of the Armenian Ordinary and the pastor of St. Gregory's, and the public elementary school for the Armenians.
While the 30 families chosen by the Turks subjected him to 300 lashings on the soles of his feet — attempts to force him to admit his guilt for aiding the Armenians to escape.
Bishop Zohrabian traced the story of the Armenian persecution during his dedication address. He recalled that he reached Athens on March 10, 1923, and immediately received help from the Orthodox Archbishop of Athens making possible the transfer of 20,000 Armenians from Asia Minor.
The Holy See established the Ordinarie for the Armenian Rite Catholics in Greece in 1925, and Father Zohrabian was named its head. He recalled that one of his first moves was to invoke St. Teresa of Lisieux, who had been canonized the same year, as protector of the mission.
While the Pro-cathedral of St. Gregory the Illuminator was built early during his tenure, and another church was established at Kokkinia, near Piraeus, it was not until 1936 that the Ordinarie was able to buy the land for the refugees' apartments. He said in his address that the 23-year lag between the time of acquiring the land and completion of the building would have been even greater had it not been for the U.N. Refugee Fund and CRSNCWC.
While expressing his gratitude to all who had taken part — especially to His Eminence Gregorio Pietro XV Cardinal Argentinian, Patriarch of Cilicia of the Armenians, who had named him to preside at the dedication — Bishop Zohrabian expressed his thanks first to the people of Greece, "this country which is so Christian and so hospitable."
