Cool, Man

A real cutie to come along this week is "My Baby" by Ken Nordine on Dot. A real progressive type-combo takes off with a cool jazz background. Then Ken Nordine steps in to tell all about his baby. "I love my baby and my baby loves me" he says. They go out together to a place called "Far Out."

"My baby looks at me with that special look she has. I look back with that special look I got when my baby looks at me with that special look she has." In between these strange sentences we hear some "Far out," "crazy," "real cool" rhythm played by a nice combination of piano, bass and drums.

THE PAYOFF comes at the end when "baby" turns out to be a real baby. This baby utters some "Shoo-bee-doo" with solid beat. Even six month old babies can earn a living these days in the record business. This probably sounds ridiculous from the above description but it is really quite fascinating once you get used to it.

On the other side of the disc is another charmer called "Used to Think My Right Hand Was Uglier Than My Left." This

is a take-off on the Beatnik type of poetry that is read to jazz music. This disc is just different enough to take off like a big bird and sell a million copies.

If Rod Lauren does not become a great success it will not be RCA's fault. According to the many pictures in the brochure, Rod plays the trombone, is an actor, painter and sketches, is an acrobat, a skid diver, is proficient in archery and by the way he also sings. The two songs in this first release are "No Wonder and "If I Had A Girl." This song is almost a little too much a carbon copy of Johnny Mahlis in singing style but has a fine voice quality. The trend nowadays is to find a nineteen year old, goodlooking, well built male specimen and then hope that he can sing. It seems the teenagers are going more for the handsome singers than for the singing singers. However, Rod sings all the physical tests and owns an excellent voice to boot. The two songs are ballad, well arranged, well written and well sung.

"DO-RE-MI" is a brand new song from the brand new musical "The Sound of Music" by Rodgers and Hammerstein and starring Mary Martin. The song, on the light side, is almost what the title implies — an explanation of the words which make up the musical scale by the teacher to the children. Peggy Lee has recorded a snappy tune called "You Don't Care" on Capitol. Backed up by light rhythm and punctuated by hand clapping, Peggy bounces through the melody with all of her years of "know-how" behind her. This gal is a real artist, whether she is singing ballads, novelties, jazz, anything.

Capitol dropped off a couple of other goodies this week. "Love Is The Only Thing" by Tennessee Ernie Ford is a "Dry Bones" type of song with a nice lift and a happy message. "There's a little bit of good in the work of us and there's a little bit of bad in the best of us but there's a little bit of love in all of us and love is the only thing."

IF YOU LIKE the Kingston Trio you'll like this one — "Coo-Coo-U" on Capitol. It sounds like a calypso folk tune and the Kingston Trio sing and play it with all the gimmicks they can muster. It's a catchy thing and the silly words are kind of fascinating.

Destined to be a big seller is "Lucky Devil" by Carl Dobkins, Jr. on Decca. It's a rockabilly but not too offensive. The beat is kept light enough, the tune is pleasant and Carl Dobkins, Jr. is one of the better rock singers.

'Uneasy Robbery'

A torrent of trouble with inter-racial overtones booms in "ODDS AGAINST TOMORROW" at the Loew's Theater for ADULTS ONLY. Robert Wise, this year's Academy Award-winning director, chooses a story of racial distrust for his fiction.

HARRY BELAFONTE gives a powerful performance of a Negro night-club singer and at the same time being troubled by a \$7500 gambling debt and a tough trio's pressure to pay. This is disconcerting because the alert Belafonte could find away, it seems, to throw off the debt and hoodlums. But here he is — listening to an inept plot to rob a small bank.

REALISM BUILDS in ever mounting suspense to the startling conclusion. A haunting unbusiness of mood is accentuated by the Modern Jazz Quartet background music and by good photography designed to give shadowy, weird effects.

So, that's about it. Take it for what it is worth but it should at least give an enjoyable evening on the town.

Looking down the Avenue we see that the Paramount Theater has "CAREER," the show business story done in honest, goodness fashion for ADULTS ONLY. Dean Martin, Shirley MacLaine, and Carolyn Jones hold the major parts in this 99 minute movie which has interest with a flaw or two along the route.
