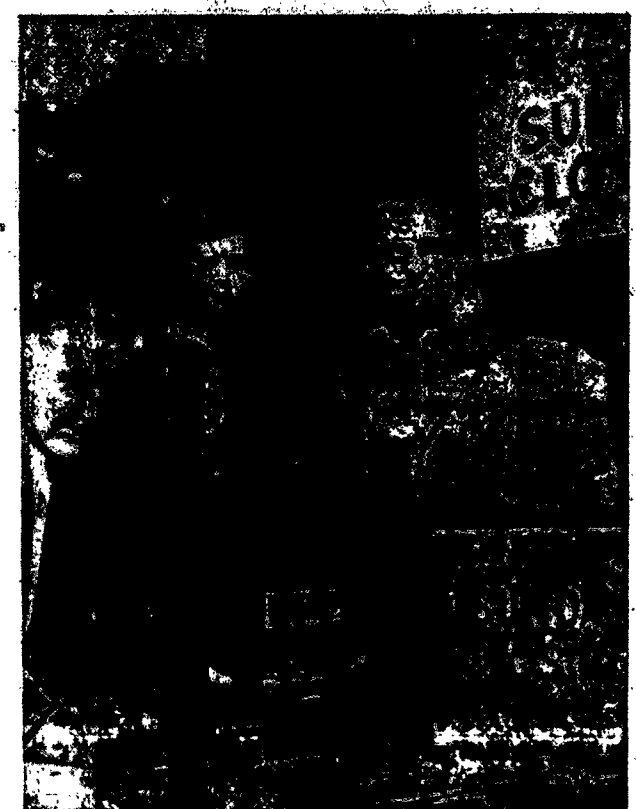

Confraternity Activities Discussed In Ithaca

Ithaca — The monthly meeting of the Executive Board of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine was held in immaculate Conception School, Ithaca, on Tuesday evening, Nov. 10. Rev. William Thomas, assistant moderator, was present at the meeting.

Charles Christian, president of the Confraternity in Ithaca, conducted the business meeting. Other officers are Jane Reed, Secretary and Joseph Farley, Treasurer.

The Confraternity is made up of six divisions.

Mrs. John Churey, Chairman of the Parent-Educators, told of the present work of her Committee. Members of this Committee, visit the homes of Catholic parishioners who have recently become parents. These visits are made regularly at intervals of three months from infancy, until the child reaches the age of three years.

Literature, especially prepared to help the parents teach religion to the child of pre-school age, is given to the new parents by the parent-educators. Parishioners whose homes are visited are becoming increasingly appreciative of the work this committee and look forward to the visits of the parent-educators.

AT PRESENT there are about 20 active members on this Committee; however many more are needed. Those who are interested in becoming a part of this necessary work which takes less than an afternoon a month, or even a little time as one afternoon every two or three months, are invited to call Mrs. Churey at 8693 and she will be glad to give them further information.

Mrs. Willis Cross, chairman of the Helpers Division, reported on the number of Helpers presently active on her committee. She stated that the homes of 11 parishioners are currently being used for "released-time" classes in Religious Education of Catholic children attending public schools.

Six members of the parish are providing transportation when needed; about nine volunteers offer their services for typing and mimeographing when called upon; 5 women act as baby sitters when the need arises within the Confraternity. Five other women are on call to help in miscellaneous ways when needed.

Milwaukee — (NC) — It is estimated that by 1975 a 20-year-old girl entering Religious life has an excellent chance of living to the age of 80, or more.

This gives her an advantage of four extra years over her counterpart in the world. This estimate is based on the results of two extensive studies on the life expectancy of nuns in the United States. The studies were reported by Con J. Fischer, associate professor of economics at the University of Dayton, Ohio, in the November issue of Catholic Management Journal, published here.

The very Rev. Paul L. O'Connor, S.J., Xavier president, presented the medal to the physician who has dedicated his life to helping provide medical care to underprivileged nations.

Congo Prelate Upholds Natives

Kabgayi, Ruanda-Urundi — (RNS) — Roman Catholic Bishop Andre Perraudin, Vicar Apostolic of Kabgayi, sharply denied charges by native leaders that he favors continuation of Belgian rule in this United Nations trusteeship territory.

He made the denial in a pastoral letter in the wake of outbreaks of tribal unrest resulting from the spread of anti-Belgian agitation in the Congo to which Ruanda-Urundi is united administratively under a vice-governor.

THE SWISS-BORN prelate declared there was no justification of such charges, because it is "not the bishop of one party or one political opinion, but the bishop of all." He stressed that he was inspired "solely by demands of justice and social charity."

Catholic observers here hailed the bishop's pastoral as the first major Church statement on the present conflict between the Belgian administration and extreme nationalists in the Congo and Ruanda-Urundi.

The Union National Ruandaise Party (UNAR) has ac-

used the Catholic Church in general and Bishop Perraudin in particular of plotting against King Kigory V and seeking "to suppress the people's lawful struggle for freedom in favor of continued Belgian rule."

In his pastoral, Bishop Perraudin appealed to the Native population "not to listen to those who preach hatred and violence under the pretext of love for a group or an idea."

He stressed that "all races are equal before God," and that "from the Christian viewpoint, racial differences must be absorbed in the higher community of the brotherhood of man." Last April, Bishop Perraudin joined three other Catholic bishops in upholding demands by the native population of Ruanda and Urundi for a greater share of the conduct of their own affairs. However, the bishops said the Church opposes "sudden solution" and advocates "a just and progressive freedom" for the area.
