**A MAJORITY OF ONE**—Mrs. Jacoby of Brooklyn, U.S.A. and Mr. Asano of Tokyo, Japan represent West and East. As played by Gertrude Berg and Sir Cedric Hardwicke, the comedy of the twin not only meeting but on the point of uniting is popular comedy. At the Barrymore.

**FLOWER DRUM SONG**—San Francisco's Chinatown is the scene of this grade B Rodgers and Hammerstein musical with two Japanese girls in the lead. Popular and clean. At the St. James.

**FIORILLO**—Very clever and sympathetic musical of New York's best Mayor and his entrance into political life and

**GOLDEN FLEECE**—Very pleasant farce with Tom Poston about a Naval Lieutenant who tries to break the bank in Venice with the very unofficial help of the IBM computer on his ship. At the Henry Miller.

**GYPSY**—Ethel Merman at her most outrageous as the mother of "Baby June" and Gypsy Rose Lee. How she exploits Baby June in vaudeville is very funny but when she shoves Rose into burlesque in Act II it simply brings back Minsky in raw form. At the Broadway.

**HEARTBREAK HOUSE**—Made up as G.B.S. himself, Mr. Maurice Evans as Captain Shotover, presides over his eccentric family circle and their brilliant talk. A cast directed by Harold Clurman includes Pamela Brown, Diana Wynyard, Diane Cilento, Sam Levene and Alan Webb. Closes by February. At the Billy Rose.

**LA PLUME de ma Tante**—French revue which won the Drama Critics Award and ranges from highest fun to some low taste. At the Royale.

**MY FAIR LADY**—Still the tops. At the Mark Hellinger.

**ONCE UPON A MATTRESS**—Based on Hans Anderson's tale of the Princess and the Pea this amusing medieval musical with a score by Harry Rodgers has discovered a new commedienne, Carol Burnett, and has moved from the Phoenix up to the Alvin.

**OUR TOWN**—Beautiful revival by Jose Quintero of Wilder's great play. At Circle-in-the-Square.

**REDHEAD**—Revolves about Gwen Verdon, clever and captivating, as the niece of two Victorian spinners who run a Wax-world Museum. Richard Kiley contributes his share to a very amusing and lively musical. At the Forty-Sixth Street.

**SWEET BIRD OF YOUTH**—Geraldine Page gives an astounding performance as an ageing screen star in Tennessee Williams' vicious picture of a wastrel returning to his home town. Directed by Ella Kazan at the Martin Beck.

**TAKE ME ALONG**—George M. Cohan once starred in Eugene O'Neill's comedy **AH, WILDERNESS**. Now as a musical the emphasis is not on the father, Walter Pidgeon, but on Jackie Gleason as Uncle Syd and alcoholism is further exploited in a lewd ballet with Audrey Hepburn "in de sheck" costumes. Robert Morse wins honors as the boy and Eileen Herlie with the one good voice in the cast is charming as Aunt Lilly. So are the sets by Oliver Smith. At the Shubert.

**THE GANG'S ALL HERE**—Melvyn Douglas, made up as a replica of President Warren G. Harding, is the center of a sensational drama about a corrupt administration with fictional characters in the cabinet. The president is made a suicide. At the Ambassador.

**ONLY IN AMERICA**—The factual story of Harry Golden, the famous southern Jewish editor with Nehemiah Perloff in a warm and genial performance in a nice play. At the Cort.

**THE MARRIAGE-GO-ROUND**—Charles Boyer and Claudette Colbert in a supersophisticated comedy of married life with quadrangular complications and sharp lasses from good taste. Cheap with smartly played. At the Plymouth.

**THE MIRACLE WORKER**—The miracle is reaching the soul of little Helen Keller, blind and deaf, by teaching her the meaning of language. Ann Bancroft is the young Irish teacher, Annie Sullivan and Patsy Duke, aged ten is Helen. Patricia Neal also contributes to an emotional intensity as Mrs. Keller. Remarkably good production. At the Playhouse.

**THE MUSIC MAN**—Don't miss Scene I—one of the most original in town. The play, lyrics and music are all by Meredith Willson who is helped by Robert Preston in keeping the action as active as the band Nooky perhaps but clean American fun! At the Majestic.

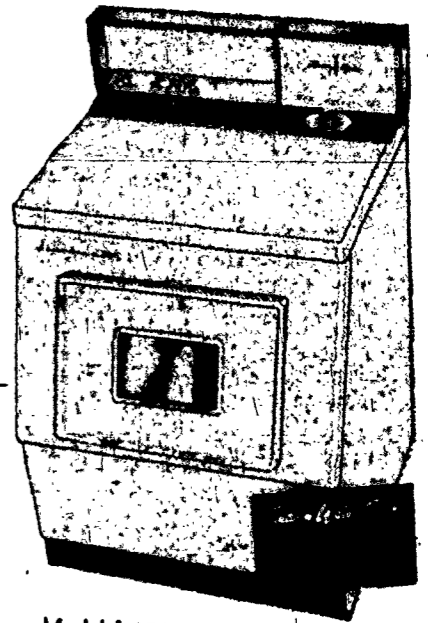

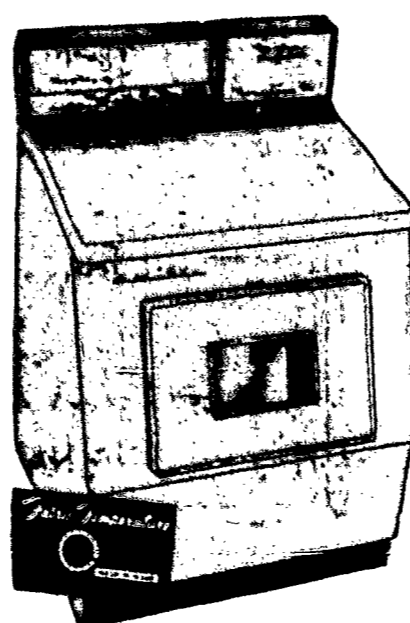

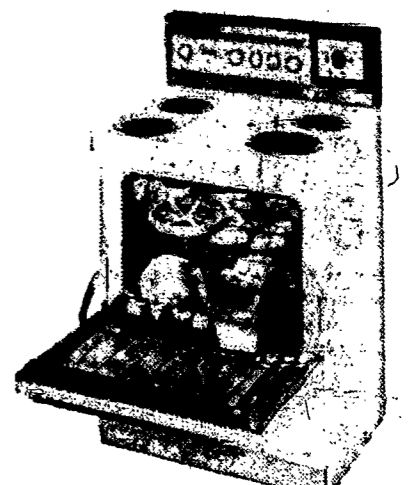
