Home Aids To Students Explained At De Sales

Geneva — Two members of the school staff, the chaplain and the principal, were speakers at the general meeting of the De Sales High School P.T.A. in the school gymnasium.

The Rev. Richard A. Hart, chaplain, and Sister Rose Adelaide, principal, spoke on the school program and the field of education. They were introduced by the president, Donald Eades.
