Home From Far East

Looking For A 'Song'

A Rochester girl was home from Indonesia to visit her parents this week but she will soon be back in that Far East, near-the-equator mission outpost.

Miss Francine Wickes, whose sister Mariette is doing mission work in Ruanda-Urundi, Africa, told her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Francis Wickes of 115 Deerfield Drive, of her work in a nation 90 per cent Moslem.

HER JOB is to teach English and music to teachers in Java's capital city, Semarang, which teems with 500,000 people.

"They are tolerant of our faith, many are sympathetic. They are anxious to learn all they can to make their nation a better place to live in," she said.

Ruled by the Dutch for centuries, the newly independent nation "is firm in its neutrality" between Communism and the Western democracies. Communists, however, are "active, zealous and quite numerous," Miss Wickes stated.

She is a member of the Grail, an international lay apostolic group.

Her purpose in coming to America? To see her parents, much needed house "for yes. But she said the Grail song." "And I'm here to try to find the song," Miss Wickes said.
