

### Geneva Woman Cited In New Librarians' Book

An experience of a Geneva librarian, Miss Pauline Jennings, is cited by Adrian A. Paradise in his new book, "Librarians Wanted."

Miss Jennings, librarian at the Geneva Experiment Station, one time responded to a physician's plea for help in determining a poison which had made a 3-year-old Ohio boy unconscious after he had eaten seeds of a shade tree.

THE TREE was classed as Laburnum Anagyroides or Golden Rain Tree. Dr. Desmond Dolan, coordinator of the Plant

Introduction Section of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, identified the poison as an alkaloid. Miss Jennings' task was to find its name.

In 20 minutes she had the answer and it was given to the physician who had waited on the telephone. As a result, the boy recovered.

Paradis cites the incident to show that librarians stand ready to serve the public every day of the year.

Miss Jennings lives at 220 Washington Street, Geneva. She is a member of St. Stephen's parish.

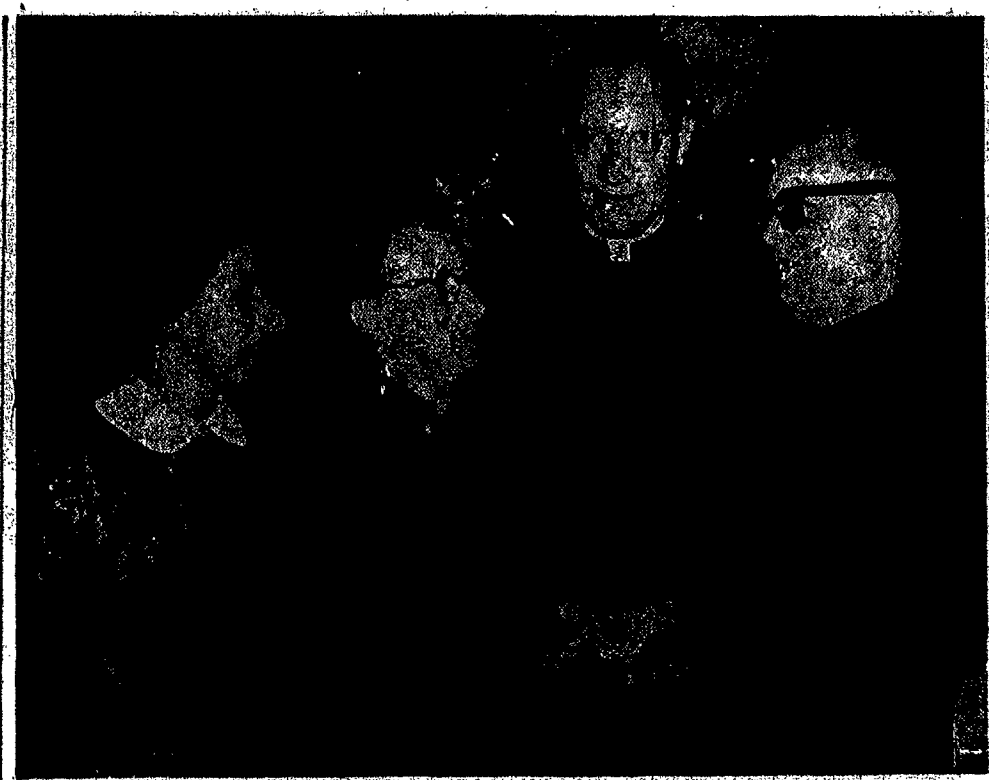
MR. GERALD CONROY, piano accompanist, directed the group singing of traditional Christmas songs and refreshments were served.
