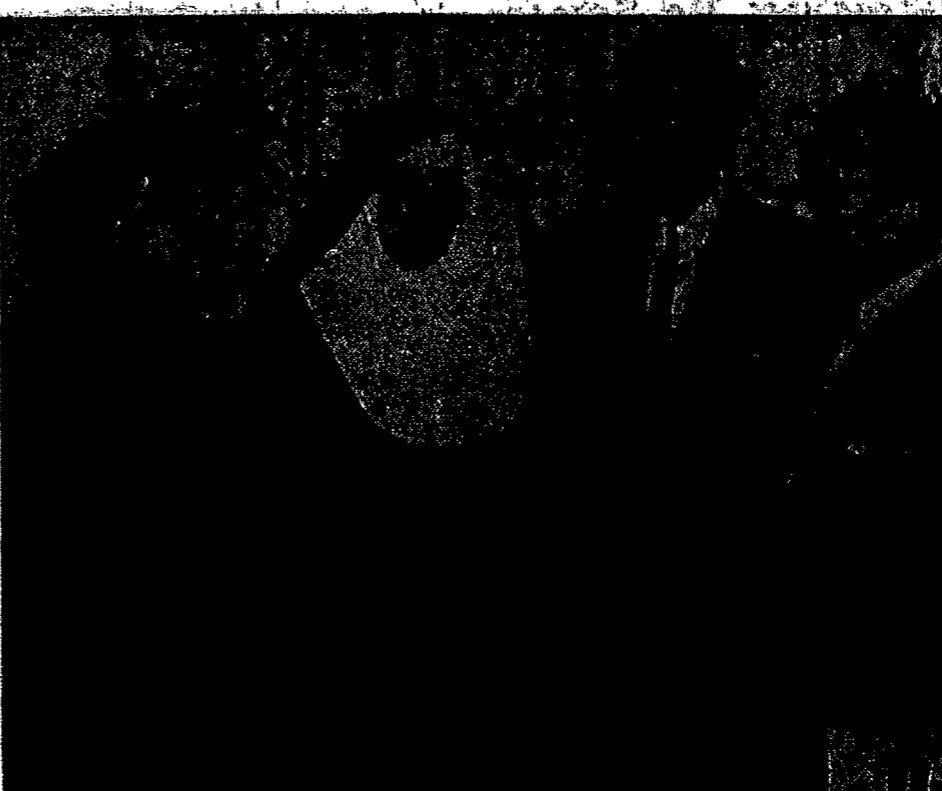

### Faith Freedom In Mexico Despite Old Hate Laws

Cayetano — (NC) — Absolute freedom of religion now exists in Mexico, President Adolfo Lopez Mateos declared here.

FOR DECADES religion has suffered from discriminatory laws in Mexico. Persecution of the Church, begun during the early stages of Mexico's revolution, was legalized by provisions of the 1917 constitution. Vigorously carried out, persecution continued into the 1920s, the laws are no longer strictly enforced.

In recent years Mexican presidents have rarely spoken on religious matters, except for former President Manuel Avila Camacho (1940-46) who stated: "I am a believer."

President Lopez made his statement here during a tour of strongly Catholic Queretaro state in answer to a question by a labor leader, Fermín Nieto, Mr. Nieto claimed his union was the victim of discrimination because he and most of its members are Catholics.

He then asked if religious beliefs excluded a person from taking part in the social and labor respects of the revolution. The President, who belongs to the Institutional Revolutionary party, replied:

"I wish to tell you here in Queretaro where the constitution was formulated that absolute freedom of belief exists in Mexico and that in the vast constructive work of the revolution there is a place for all men of good will."

**Native Clergy Staff Diocese**  
Washington — (NC) — Reflecting the progress of the native clergy in Africa, the White Fathers of Africa have turned over the ninth African diocese in 20 years for administration by the African hierarchy and clergy.

Father J. Alfred Richard, White Fathers, said that turning over of the Diocese of West Africa, which the White Fathers formerly administered, "marks another milestone in the progress of the African Church."
