Father Grasso Honored At Christmas Fete English Singing Star To Enter Cloister

London — (RNS) — One of Britain's most talented singers of the younger generation, 29-year-old soprano Jean Reddy, a convert to the Roman Catholic Church, has announced that she is giving up her career to enter an enclosed order of contemplative nuns.

She was recently invited to sing in opera with the Carl Rosa Company. Now she is to join the Tyburn Nuns, as they are usually known, who maintain perpetual adoration of the Blessed Sacrament at their convent near London's Marble Arch.

The convent is within a few yards of the site of Tyburn Tree, the place of execution where hundreds of martyrs suffered for their faith in the 16th and 17 centuries.

THE NUNS are a Benedictine congregation, founded in Paris at Montmartre. In 1901, French laws against religious orders forced them to leave Paris and they came to London at the invitation of Cardinal Herbert Vaughan, then the Archbishop of Westminster. Two years later they purchased their house at the Marble Arch.

The nuns have their novitiate at Royston, in Hertfordshire — their only other house in Eng- land — and it is there that Miss Reddy will receive the religious habit.

"I BECAME A Roman Catho- lic two years ago while study- ing in Italy," Miss Reddy said.
