

Foreign Policy Lecture Scheduled At Nazareth

"Current Trends In American Foreign Policy" will be discussed by Dr. John Francis Parr, before students at Nazareth College at Students' Hour on Jan. 7.

Dr. Parr, Dean of the School of Foreign Service at Georgetown University, took his Bachelor's and Master's degrees at Georgetown. Work for his Ph.D. was completed at the University of Fribourg, Switzerland.

DURING WORLD WAR II, in which he served from 1941-45, Dr. Parr rose from the rank of Ensign to Lieutenant Commander in the U. S. Navy, which later rank he presently holds in the reserves. Areas of wartime service included South America, the North Atlantic and the Mediterranean.

In 1948, Dr. Parr became assistant director of the Bureau of International Affairs, National Catholic Welfare Conference in Washington, D.C., in which position he travelled in every Latin American country on behalf of Catholic Social Action.

As assistant professor of history and government for the University of Maryland overseas program, Dr. Parr lectured and gave courses in France, England, Austria, and Turkey. In Paris, in 1952, Dr. Parr published a book on "Thophile Delcasse and His Diplomacy."

AN APPOINTMENT as assistant professor of history at the University of Fribourg made him the first American professor on the regular staff of the Swiss university. He returned to Georgetown in 1956 as assistant dean of the School of Foreign Service, and in 1958 became its dean.

Dr. Parr's familiarity with the training of modern American diplomats is said to serve as an excellent background for the lecture which he will present.

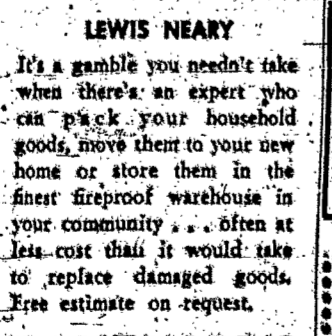
