Last year's second-place finishers swelled to a five-gamer binge on the rack by sweeping 18 of 18 possible points in the final month.

Clare (28-18), a stranger to the top rung until two weeks before the mid-season break, solidified its lead by whitewashing Meath (25-25) Friday night, Dec. 18.

IN OTHER action:
