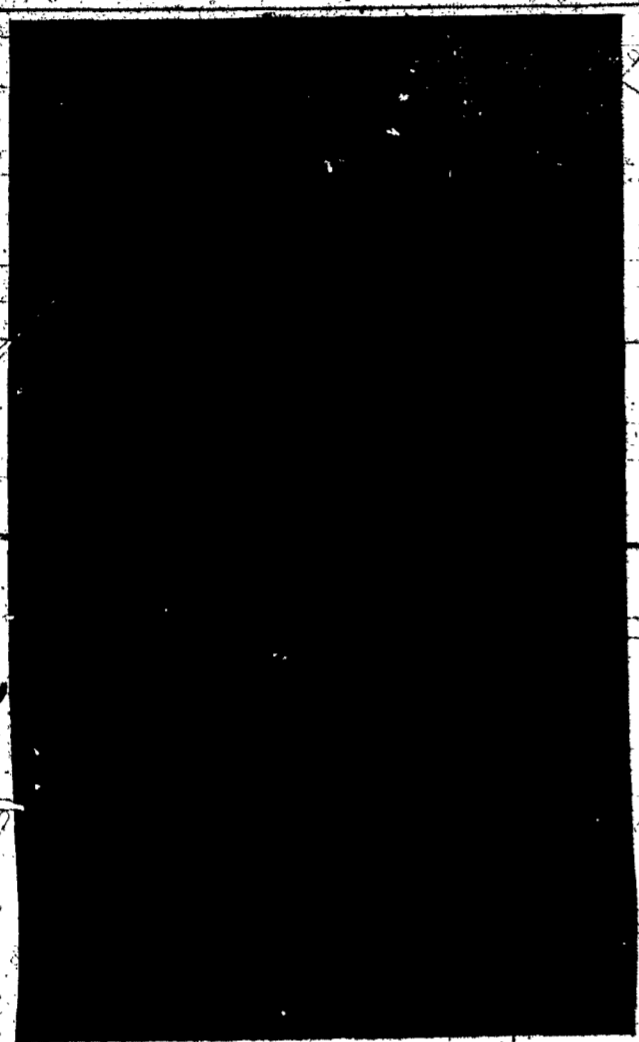


Elmira Seminarians Feled
