

## High Record Total Reported For Diocesan Clothing Drive

A record total of 392,824 pounds of clothing was collected by parishes in the Rochester Diocese in the annual Thanksgiving Clothing Collection drive held in November, according to Rev. E. Leo McMannus, diocesan director. The total was 31 tons over the amount collected in 1958. Sacred Heart Cathedral parish contributed the most clothing with 40,125 pounds. Tabulation follows:

## College Exhibit To Show Work Of Nun-Artist

The Art Department of Nazareth College will hold an exhibit of serigraphs (silkscreen prints) through February 13, on the third floor of the college. The serigraphs are the work of Sister Mary Carita, I.H.M., of Immaculate Heart College, Los Angeles, California.

Sister Mary Carita's work is well-known, having been discussed in such national magazines as "Glamour," "Craft Horizons," and "Charm." A personal look at the serigraphs was afforded to many in Sister's one-man show, held in Chicago, Cincinnati, Grove, Fla., Boston, Dallas, Kansas City, Mo., Akron, Colorado Springs, Los Angeles, and recently, in the Morris Galery in New York City.

**SISTER MARY CARITA** has lectured extensively in all sections of the country, and with her department head, Sister Magdalene Mary, has conducted workshops at Catholic University in Washington, D.C.

"Art" Magazine, in the November 1959 issue, said of Sister Mary Carita's show in the Morris Galery: "These generous, rich-colored, exuberant-formed serigraphs are celebrations of love. Most of them have religious subjects, and all of the mysteries here are joyful ones. Sister's work is a portrait of state of being. It seems to be one familiar to the artist — as the works express this wonder. As for the medium itself, it has been made through long experience to be the force of the artist's intention. The result is a truly personal art."
