

Fr. Crispin Lynch Missionary Dies In Philippines

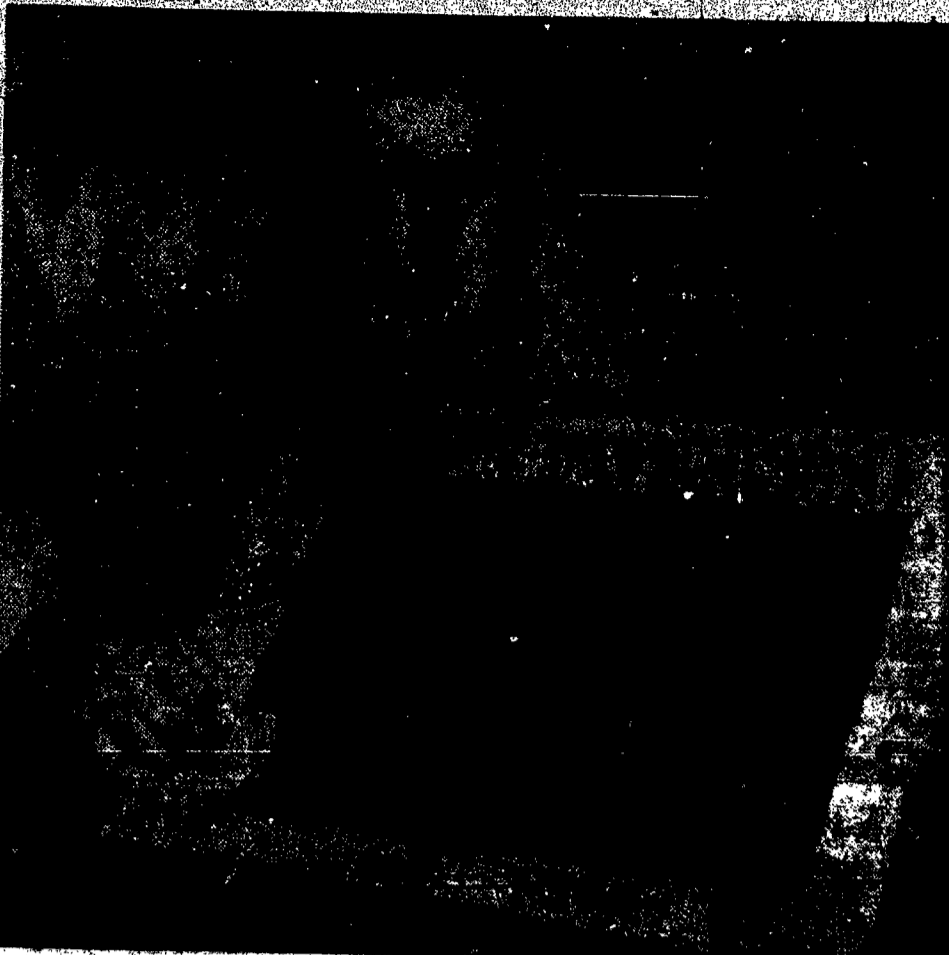
Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated in St. John the Evangelist Church, Rochester, Wednesday, Jan. 13, for the Rev. Fr. Crispin Lynch, C.P., who died of a stroke in Mindanao, the Philippines Jan. 11, 1959.

Very Rev. Rupert Langenstein, C.P., vice provincial of the congregation of the Passion, Union City, N.J., was celebrant assisted by Very Rev. Gerard Orlando, C.P., Dunkirk, as Dean, and Very Rev. Raymond Welch, C.P., Riverdale, New York City, Subdeacon.

The funeral took place in Marbel, P. I. Requiem Mass was also sung at St. Michael's Monastery, Union City, N. J.

FATHER LYNCH, who was ordained April, 1947, and came to the Philippines on Jan. 11, 1953, was the son of Sara Lynch of 77 East Blvd. He is also survived by a sister, Mrs. Howard Thomas and a brother, R. H. Lynch, both of Rochester, and another sister, Mrs. Richard Howarth of Peterboro, Ont.

Before leaving for the Philippines, Father Crispin was on the Passionist Mission Band stationed at St. Mary's Monastery, Dun-
