Newark Drive Set Sunday

Newark — Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence H. Casey will address more than 300 committeemen of St. Michael's parish at 8 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 13, prior to the parishwide canvass on Sunday for pledges toward construction of an addition to St. Michael's School.

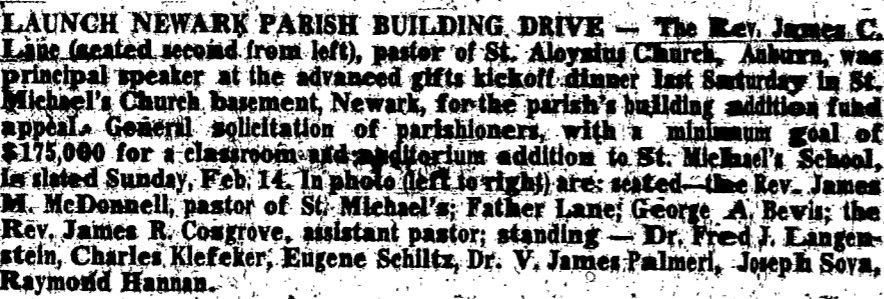
Three-year pledges, with a minimum goal of \$175,000, will be sought during a two-hour canvass Sunday afternoon, Feb. 14, toward the proposed construction of a building unit to include four classrooms and an auditorium-gymnasium.

Among former assistants at St. Michael's who will attend the Sunday dinner are the Rev. Henry A. Atwell, editor of the Catholic Courier Journal; the Rev. Thomas M. Reddington, assistant at St. Monica's, Rochester; and the Rev. John A. Connolly, assistant at St. Rita's, West Webster.

Solicitation of advanced pledges was conducted last Sunday by a committee of 50 men headed by George A. Bevik, who said Tuesday that results were "highly gratifying" and that several more still were to be returned.

GENERAL SOLICITATION from 2 to 4 p.m. Sunday will be undertaken by a committee headed by Dr. Fred J. Langenstein, Vicechairman are Edward Doane, Richard Finewood, John Palermo and Francis Smith.

The new building unit planned for completion by September, 1961, will be added to the southeast corner of the present 13-classroom school. The "all-purpose" auditorium will serve as a parish center, according to the Rev. James M. McDonnell, pastor, and will seat 600 at meetings and 400 for dinners. It will contain a basketball court.

Construction To Begin On Carmelite Monastery

Waverly — Construction of the Carmelite Monastery on Our Lady's Hill overlooking Waverly and the Charming River Valley is expected to begin in May.

The Rev. Damian Frew, O.C.D., of Brookline, Mass., and two Carmelite lay brothers, Brother Victor and Brother Martin, will establish headquarters late this month at 474 Fulton Street, Waverly.

A small private chapel will be constructed in the home. Plans and specifications for the monastery are now nearing completion by the architects, Wagner and Sullivan of Williamsport, who have had as a consultant Jacques Michel of France, an authority on Carmelite architecture.

The monastery will be built on a 170-foot elevation at the peak of a 53-acre tract given to the Carmelite Order by Edwin and William O'Brien of Waverly. Their brother, the Rev. Bartholomew O'Brien, assistant pastor at St. Peter and Paul in Elmira, was instrumental in having the Carmelites locate their new monastery in Waverly.

Last year was the first complete year since the establishment of a national office, in

Elmira for the association in the United States, and this is its first official report to be forwarded to the Center in Rome.

THIS WEEK marks the anniversary of the first Canonical Establishment of the "Sacredotal Union of Daily Adoration" in the United States. The Decree was issued during the Diocesan Eucharistic Year of 1955 on Feb. 11 by Bishop Kearney.

The association of the "Daily Holy Hour" is established not only for priests of the Secular Clergy, but also for seminarians and members of the laity. National Director is the Rev. Bartholomew O'Brien, assistant pastor at St. Peter and Paul's Church, Elmira.

AS OF THE present date, the largest number of priest-members comes from the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Newark, and from the Diocese of Ogdensburg, Rochester, and Scranton.
