

'Repentance, Shrine For Nazi Victims'

Hilzenburg (RNS) — Plans for a Catholic "repentance church" will be built at Bergen, a small community near the notorious Nazi concentration camp of Bergen-Belsen in the Lueneburg Heath, were announced here by Bishop Heinrich Mark Johnson of Hildesheim.

The church will become a memorial shrine to the victims of the Hitler regime and especially to the 50,000 persons, mostly Jews, who were killed in the camp. The foundation stone will be laid on June 17, the day of the abortive 1953 uprising of East German workers against the Communist Soviet Zone regime.

One of the mass graves at the camp contains the remains of Anne Frank, the heroic Jewish girl whose diary was written during the Nazi occupation of Holland in World War II and achieved world-wide fame.

Student Loan Oath Said

Inept Law

St. Louis University today issued a statement opposing the oath and affidavit provisions of the National Defense Education Act to provide loans for American college students, but said it would not withdraw from the program since this would constitute a denial of its students' free choice in the matter.

The University said that while the intent of the law was laudable, unless those the law seeks to exclude from getting the benefits would be most likely to seek their funds by perjury and lies, thus making the law an inept instrument. The statement comments that "Inept law is bad law."

The oath provision is unfair, the University contends, because students are required to swear their loyalty to common benefits of citizenship and law.

It is used for a specialized program to train Steward Specialists, also known as Airman Aides. These are enlisted men who are assigned to the personal staffs of all officers of general rank in the Air Force.

Rep. Kowalski, who retired as a colonel after 33 years of Army service, prior to his election to Congress in 1958, has charged that the military forces are using thousands of unskilled bodied men as "household servants" and that the Air Force has gone so far as to institute a special training program to teach them how to perform menial household tasks.

Among other things, the manual tells enlisted men how to wash an officer's dog, tend for potted plants, and prepare a grocery list.

The section that has drawn criticism has been entitled by the American Civil Liberties Union and some publishers' groups, confines itself to evaluating magazines and paperback books easily accessible to youth. Jersey City (RNS) — A Catholic priest has been named by the City Commission here to head its \$1,000,000 drive against slum areas in Jersey City.

Rev. Msgr. Lary E. McWilliams, pastor of St. Michael's church here, who will serve as director of the revamped Jersey City Rehabilitation Bureau.

As unsalaried head of the bureau, Msgr. McWilliams will direct teams of city inspectors to enforce health, fire and building codes in housing. Violators must correct sub-standard conditions or face stiff fines.

The priest has been leading a committee of nine clergymen which has revitalized the city's flagging effort to arrest housing blight.

All clergymen in the city have been urged by the commission to report the address of any place "where someone is making money on human misery."

Unity Asked In Uganda

Kampala (RNS) — Church Missionary Society (Anglican) and Catholic authorities in Uganda's Northern Province jointly expressed concern here over growing divisions and dissensions among the population and urged an end to "interdenominational strife."

"We are agreed that the cause of the divisions which exist between our peoples are not in fact religious differences at all," said a joint message read in churches in Acholi, Lango, West Nile and Karamoja. "They are political matters, and some of them go back to the old rivalry between clans."

The message voiced particular regret that some who claim to be followers of Christ are leaders in creating divisions and fostering hatred."

CHRISTIAN religion and Christian faith should not be identified with any one political party," the statement declared. "All Christian men and women have a duty to be interested in the affairs of their country, and have a moral obligation to ensure that the political party to which they belong uses Christian methods to further its aims." Slander and stirring up of hatred against others, the church leaders stressed, should have no part in Christians' activities.
