Rites Held For Father Of Nuns
Funeral services for Verlan Francione, 78, of 43 Delamaine Dr., who died Feb. 8, 1960, were held at the August M. Maier Funeral Home, 400 W. St. Andrew Church on Wednesday, Feb. 10. A solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated by Rev. Michael Volpe, assisted by Rev. William J. Riles as deacon, and Rev. Paul G. Wohlrab as sub-deacon. A number of pallbearers were present in the parish.

Mr. Francione, a native of Italy, came to Rochester from Pennsylvania about 1920. He was a dresser at Fashion Park, Inc. for 22 years, until his retirement in 1947.

He is the father of two sons-in-law in the order of Sisters of Mercy. Sister Mary Faith is principal at St. Joseph School, Penfield, and Sister Mary Catherine is a teacher at St. Thomas School.

Mr. Francione was a member of Societa Maria SS Del Suffragio.

Besides the nuns, Mr. Francione is survived by four sons, Albert, John, Ernest, and Orville; two daughters, Miss Anna Francione and Mrs. Carl (Mary Ann) Siantangelo; three brothers, Dominic and Louis Francione, of Waterloo, and Marie, of Detroit, Mich.; one sister, Mrs. Millie Mudge, Philadelphia, Pa.; 12 grandchildren, and several nieces and nephews.

Interment was in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery, where the final blessing at the grave was given by the Rev. Fr. John J. Volpe, D.D., and John D. Malley.
