### Consolation For Shut-ins

Baraga, Mich. (AP)—With the aid of modern electronics, a permanently stationed priest brings spiritual consolation to other shut-ins throughout the country.

Victim of a progressive disease which makes every talking for long periods in effort, Father Marion Roessler, O.F.M. Cap., has long been an invalid at the Sacred Heart convalescent of the Capuchin Fathers.

But disease has not sapped his zeal to help others. Father Roessler has recorded a series of readings from spiritual classics which explain to the chronically ill how to cope in permitting their suffering.

The series covers an entire year and includes two records per month. Subscribers pay two dollars for each two-record set. There are now more than 100 subscribers, according to Father Roessler.
