Newark — Pledges totaling \$262,486 — more than \$27,000 over the minimum goal — were reported Tuesday by the Rev. Joseph M. McDonnell, pastor of St. Michael's Church, as the campaign for funds for an addition to the parish school neared its close.

Parishioners had been asked to make three-year pledges toward the proposed construction of a wing to the southeast corner of the present 13-classroom school which would include four additional classrooms and an "all-purpose" auditorium-gymnasium.

FATHER McDONNELL said bids will be let as soon as possible for the project. He hoped to break ground this spring so that the building could be roofed by next winter. Completion is planned for September, 1961.
