Diocesan High Basketball Tourney Title Again Won By Aquinas Five

Maroon and White eagles of Aquinas Institute are champions of the Diocese of Rochester Catholic High School basketball tournament by virtue of convincing triumphs over McQuaid Jesuit 68-38 in the semifinal and Mt. Carmel of Auburn in the final, 51-45.

A sell-out crowd of 8,439 at the War Memorial, the largest crowd to witness an amateur event, saw Ronnie Mack's Aquinas club make it two in succession, in the infant tournament, in scoring its convincing win over George Monagan's McQuaid team; Saturday.

In the championship card at RIT, last Sunday afternoon, 1,200 faithful followers, four bus loads from Auburn, saw McQuaid beat St. Anthony of Padua of Watkins Glen, 56-59, to top the consolation crown. This was a repeat performance for McQuaid in the consolation round.

Aquinas had rough going in the final against the well-drilled and aggressive Mt. Carmel team. The score was close throughout, with the outcome in doubt until the final minutes of play.

THE LARGEST crowd ever to witness a local sports event was at the East-West All-Star NBA game in 1958. The 8,439, just a mere 78 short of the record attendance, was a conservative figure. This total at the War Memorial didn't include the ducks handled by the scalpers, who had set up shop in front of the War Memorial.
