\$250,000 Drive Set In Auburn

Auburn — St. Mary's parish campaigned for a new school building was announced from the pulpit at Mass Sunday by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. James D. Cuffney administrator.

Monsignor Cuffney stressed the need for the new school building which will be erected on parish property on Cayuga Street. The feasibility of the new location was explained in detail as well as the need for sacrifice and cooperation on the part of each and every parishioner.

The minimum campaign goal is \$250,000 to help pay for a replacement for the present 80-year-old structure. The funds will be sought in the form of pledges payable over a three-year period. The payments may be made weekly, monthly or yearly.

The new school building will include sixteen classrooms with a total enrollment capacity of 800 students. A cafeteria and health room will be available to the pupils.

AT THE PRESENT time the General Committee is being formed with the end in mind of a committee sizable enough to canvass the entire parish on solicitation Sunday, May 1.

Honorary Chairman for the campaign is the Rt. Rev. Msgr. William E. Cowan, pastor emeritus of New York.


