Council on Social Work Education is to be held in Montreal, Canada, Feb. 1-4, 1955. Sister has written and lectured widely in the field of Child Study, and collaborated last year with Dr. Clifford D. Ford in a study entitled "A Study of the Parents of 1,000 Delinquent Boys," which was published by the New York State Department of Corrections.

The study appeared serially in the Sunday Times-Union of Albany, New York. Sister is the author of the book "Parent-Child Relationships," and has had several book reviews published in the "American Catholic Sociological Review."

The 1960 Golden Anniversary White House Conference will attempt to achieve an interdisciplinary approach. The program will first examine the environmental influence upon young people under the heading "The World Around the Young", and second, in "The Young in the World", will survey the current scene from a personal and individual standpoint.

THE PROGRAM structure of the Conference will have three main elements:

1. Five Concurrent Theme Assemblies.

2. Eighteen Concurrent Forum.

3. Two Hundred and Ten Work Groups of Thirty Participants Each.

Invitations to 7000 people have been issued by President Eisenhower on recommendation of the Committee on Invitations and Credentials of the President's National Committee on Youth. International guests, numbering 500, have been invited through the Department of State.
