The annual Spaghetti Supper held by the Guild and Altar Society will take place Saturday, March 19 from 5 to 9 p.m.


Mrs. Jerry Manzari is the chairman and Mrs. Louis DeSanto co-chairman.

Funeral Mass for Sister M. Nunilo Edmonds, former principal of St. Ambrose School, was offered in Nazareth Convent Chapel, Pittsford, Saturday, March 12.

SOLEMN REQUIEM Mass was celebrated by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Frank Hoeven assisted by the Rev. Orrin Feller, deacon and the Rev. Daniel Wheeler, subdeacon. Rev. Robert H. Schreyer, master of ceremonies, Rev. Joseph Reinhard and Rev. Daniel Brent, acolytes.

Sister Nunilo died Wednesday, March 9, 1960 in St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira. Sister had also taught at old St. Patrick's High School, Rochester.

A native of Prince Edward Island, Canada, she came here in 1902 to enter the Sisters of St. Joseph. Her first teaching assignment was at St. Patrick's Grammar School. From 1910 to 1922 she taught at Cathedral High. Between 1922 and 1944 she was principal of three schools: St. Mary's in Elmira, St. Aloysius in Auburn and St. Ambrose here. She taught in St. Paul's School, Ossego, before going to Our Lady's Perpetual Help School in Rochester, where she had taught the past six years.

She leaves three sisters, Mrs. Josephine McGuire and Mrs. William Powers, both of Prince Edward Island, and Mrs. Celia McQuade of Portland, Maine, and several nieces and nephews. Burial was in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.
