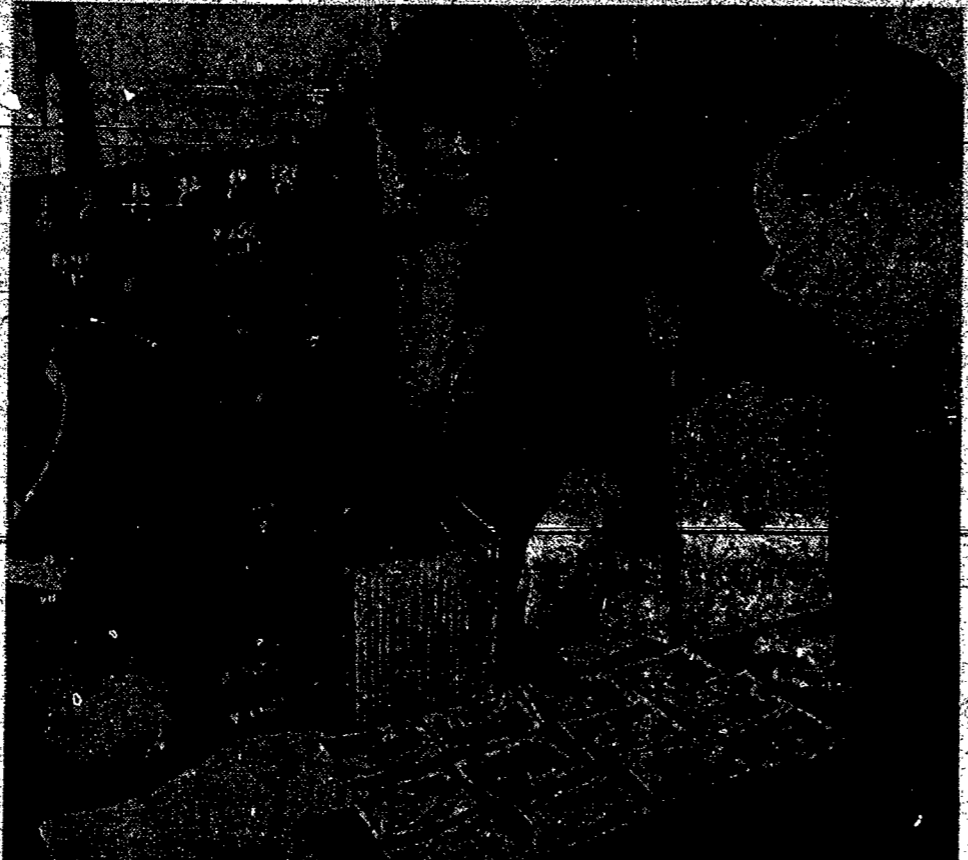

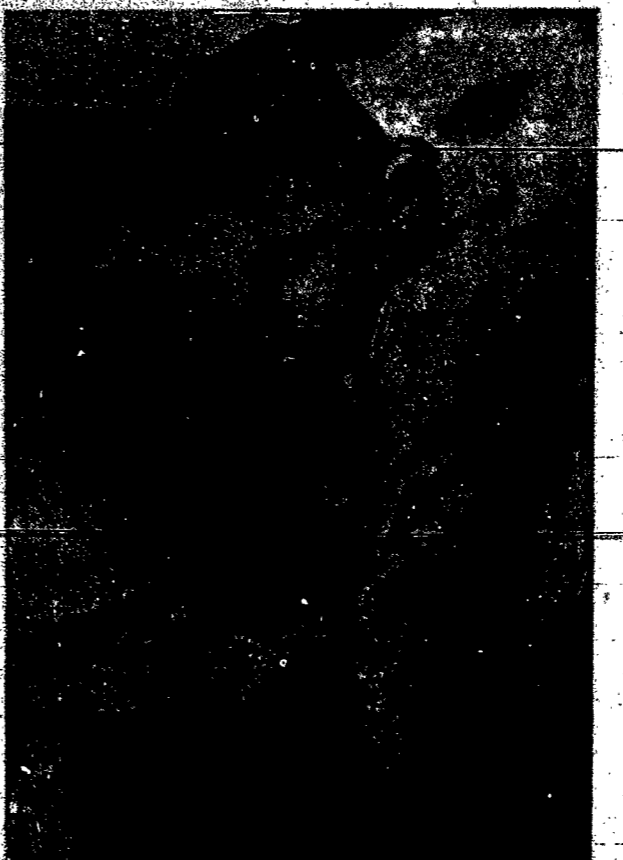

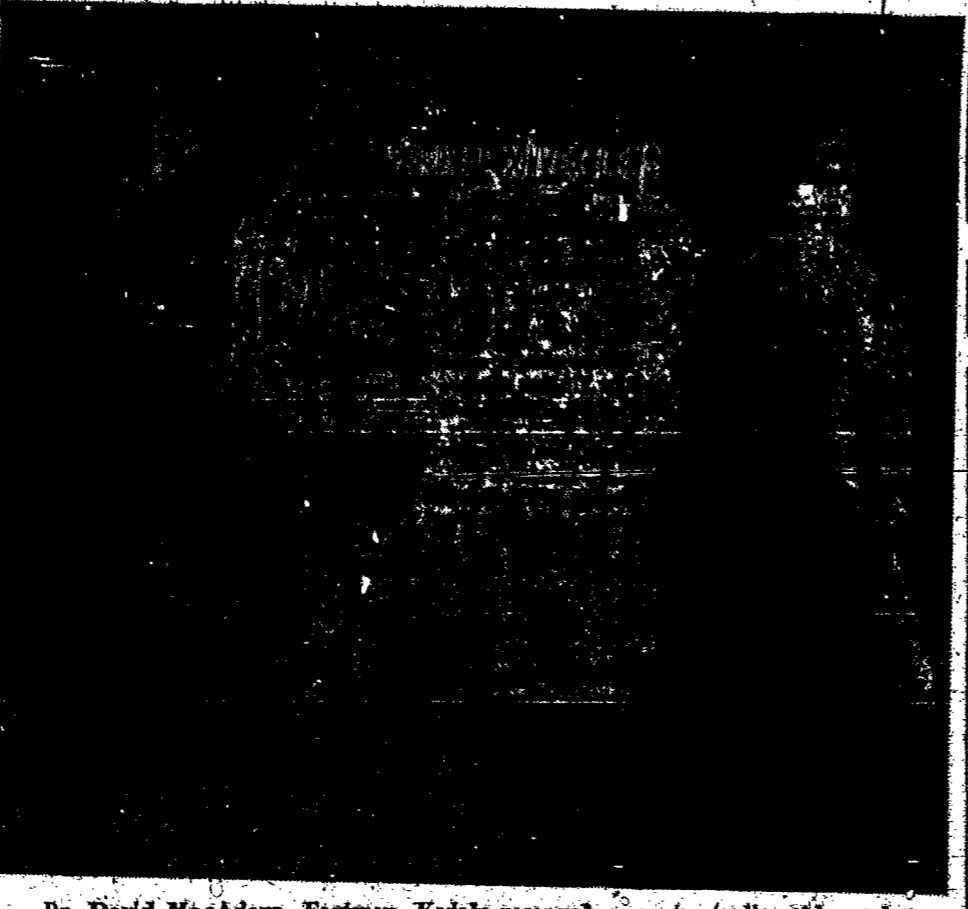
Cathedral Rediticated

Hildesheim — (RNS) — A message of greeting from Pope John XXIII was read here as thousands of Catholics attended the solemn rededication of 900-year-old Hildesheim Cathedral which was rebuilt after having been destroyed by bombs in World War II.

Bishop Heinrich Janssen of Hildesheim officiated at the rededication rites. Reconstruction work on the church took ten years and was executed at a cost of about \$1,200,000. The first dedication of the cathedral was carried out in 1069 by Bishop Hedio, one of the most renowned of the Bishops of Hildesheim.
