

Nine Given Grants To Aquinas Institute

Nine scholarships were awarded this week to local eighth graders by Aquinas Institute.

Four full tuition scholarships and five partial scholarships have been merited by Rochester area youth on the basis of a battery of achievement and aptitude tests administered recently at the Basilian Fathers' school, according to Very Reverend E. P. Magner, C.S.B., principal.

In making the announcement Father Magner once again paid tribute to the excellent caliber of students from the parochial schools who wrote both the essays and the scholarship examinations. It is evidence, he said, of the fine teaching going on in our diocesan schools.

Students writing the examinations were from as far away as Cassadaga and Ilwaco.
