**F. J. Cannan
Of Niagara U.
Dies At 65**

Francis J. Cannan, chairman of the accounting department at Niagara University since 1948 and a member of the Niagara faculty since 1945, died April 13, 1966 at Strong Memorial Hospital, Rochester. He had been hospitalized for the last two months. He was 65.

A blessing for Mr. Cannan will be given at St. Peter and Paul Church, Saturday, April 16 at 10 a.m.

Mr. Cannan, a native of East Rochester, had resided at 674 Orchard Parkway, Niagara Falls, for the last 15 years.

He was a graduate of the Rochester Division of Niagara University, where he received his bachelor of business administration degree in 1938. He later took graduate work at Cornell University and New York University and received a master of arts degree from the latter school in 1946. He received his CPA from the State of New York in 1952.

MR. CANNAN taught and coached sports at Poughkeepsie high school from 1938 until 1941 and from that time until 1943 served as an instructor in accounting at Niagara University's Rochester Division. He also was employed two years at Niagara in the Rochester offices of Ernst and Ernst, certified public accountants.

He was a member of the American Accounting Association, the New York State Society of Certified Public Accountants and the American Institute of Accountants.

His campus affiliations included membership in Sigma Alpha Sigma, campus honor society and Delta Mu Delta, accounting honor fraternity. He also was moderator of Niagara's Gamma Psi Chapter of Alpha Kappa Psi, national business fraternity.

**McQuaid Seniors Take
Science Fair Awards**

Three McQuaid seniors were among forty-seven winners of the Brockport Science Fair, on Saturday, 9. The Fair, sponsored by the Western Central Zone of the Science Teachers Association of New York State, drew three thousand and forty entrants from an eleven county area surrounding Rochester.

In the field of Earth Science, John Vassallo placed second with his snowflake exhibit in which he preserved the molds of snowflakes in plastic. Vassallo also received a first place award at the East Ridge Fair.

In the Biology Division, Niel Pappalardo took second place for his lecture demonstration on the analysis of tumor growth. In preparation for the demonstration, Pappalardo injected several mice with radioactive phosphorus and killed the animals at successive intervals, taking a cell count and radiation count from which he was able to compute the rate of division of the tumor cells.

Pappalardo, rated among the top ten percent of the nation in the Westinghouse Talent search, also took second place, at the recent East Ridge Science Fair, and first place in the Diocesan Science Fair held at St. Agnes High School.

IN PHYSICS, Joseph Aman took second place for his analog computer exhibit. With the use of the machine, complex problems in mechanics, optics, acoustics, magnetism, gravitation and electric fields. Aman also took a first place in the East Ridge Fair, and first place in Physics.
