

Calvary Continues

Reds Trample Faith In Bulgaria

Rome — (AP) — An Eastern Rite cardinal declared a Mass here for the communists-dominated countries that "the Calvary of the Church of Silence is the Calvary of Christ."

Ignace Gabriel Cardinal Tappouni, Patriarch of Antioch of the Syrians, spoke specifically of the fate of the Catholic Church in Bulgaria, systematically destroyed by the Reds.

"The bishop of 6,000 Eastern Rite Catholics was imprisoned for a period of time," he said. "The two Latin Rite bishops are still in prison. We know what prison is."

"We have a vivid memory of tens of bishops, hundreds of priests and thousands of faithful who died heroically for the Faith during the first world war."

Holding that the "Calvary of the Church of Silence is the Calvary of Christ," the Syrian Rite Patriarch declared that "he wants to forget the sufferings of the Mystical Body, is to want to forget the passion of Christ, the king of martyrs, and the compassion of Mary, queen of martyrs."
