Salt Lake City — (RNS) — World membership in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints (Mormons) now totals 1,616,000, it was reported at the group's 1960th General Conference here.

This represents a net gain of 80,289 members over last year, the report said.

Hammondsport — All of us Catholics are familiar with the second "special collections" taken up in our parish churches on certain Sundays throughout the year for the various appeals made throughout the world.

However, how many of us in our wonderful country of plenty, which boasts the "highest standard of living" in the world, have any true conception of how many of our needy world brethren depend upon our Catholic generosity to alleviate the almost insupportable burden of poverty?

The touching excerpts taken from a letter received by Hammondsport friends from a Filipino missionary, who is now in the Philippines, are shown in the photo.
