

Sisters of the Congregation of Jesus Crucified, whose members,

Their convent, the Regime Mundi Priory in this Philadel phis suburb, has established i cytology laboratory which will enable the sisters, after training by physicians, to examine slides submitted by gynecologists for the detection of cancer.

THE ORDER has its motherhouse in France where it was founded 30 years ago. Its priory here, the only one in the U.S., was opened in 1955, and now has 28 nuns in residence.

All are erippled, or otherwise affected by such allments as pollo, heart disease, rheumatines, arthritis, and arrested inhereniosis. One sister is blimit.

Besides 20 Americans, there are four French women; one rish, one Hawallan, one Chinese, and one Japanese. The order's rules admit women, aged 20 to 30, whose physical afflictions are not of a mental, neryous or contagious nature.

The Japanese nun. Mother Marie Almee, took a six month course at the Temple University Medical Center in Philadelphia to supervise the cytology lab, Two pathologists helped the nuns get their start and now serve as consultants.

In the routine examination of women patients, between five and ten cases of unsuspected cancer are defected in about every thousand microscupic studies,


Reds Expel Missioners From North Vietnam

Saigon-(RNS)-All remaining foreign Catholic missionaries and workers in North Vietnam are expected to be expelled by the Communist-dominated government there before the end of April, according to Catholic sources here.

Several priests already have been expelled since the beginning of the year and, it is believed, the two or three foreign Catholic missionaries still in North Vietnam will not be allowed to remain since their sojourn permits were valid only until Good Friday.

The North Vietnam government size has taken over several religious buildings, including those be-longing to the Redemptorist and Dominican Fathers and the Missionaries of the Paris Foreign Mission Society.
