Remember When

All but a few Americans are too young to remember when the gay, lonely and sad songs of the period from the Civil War to the turn of the Century were first popular. Some of those songs are still familiar but many have not been heard since long ago. The Merrill Station Choir, an excellent label, have recorded a number of songs of this period in the manner and spirit of those bygone times.

The idea for this album is an historical feat for it is really putting history on record. Some of the times have been handed down to us and are almost as familiar today as they were at the turn of the century. But others have been sort of forgotten and would probably die of obscurity but for the efforts of the Merrill Station Choir in their timeless collection of American songs.

Some of the familiar ones on the album are: "Grandfather's Clock," "Little Brown Jug," "When You and I Were Young, Maggie," "The Man On The Flying Trapeze" and "Drill Ye Tarriers." Some of the not-so-familiar tunes are "When Reuben Comes To Town," "Daisy Deane," "Choosing A Husband," "Since My Daughter Plays On The Piano" and "Ranch In The Presence Of The Past." This album should be a collector's item.

IN KEEPING with the western theme of his RCA Victor has recorded two more of the home-overseas type albums. "Cool Water" by the Sons of the Pioneers is an album containing seventeen timeless western favorites (all times).

The other is "The Westward Movement" by Jimmie Driftwood—twelve more middle type songs. Both albums are extremely well done both in talent and recording technique but is any one else getting middle-aged?

A NEW SLANT on the "sing along" craze was released this week by ABC-Paramount. It is called "Sing Along In Italian" by the Lombardi Singers. The album contains thirteen favorite Italian songs and the Italian lyrics are printed on the cover of the album so one can tackle the language if so inclined.

The music in accompaniment adds a European flavor and the Lombardi singers give forth with some good Neapolitan gusto in making the whole thing rather quaint. I imagine the tremendous success of the "sing along" series is due to the fact that a great number of people would rather sing along than go to a concert. Well, here it is in Italian, go to it.
