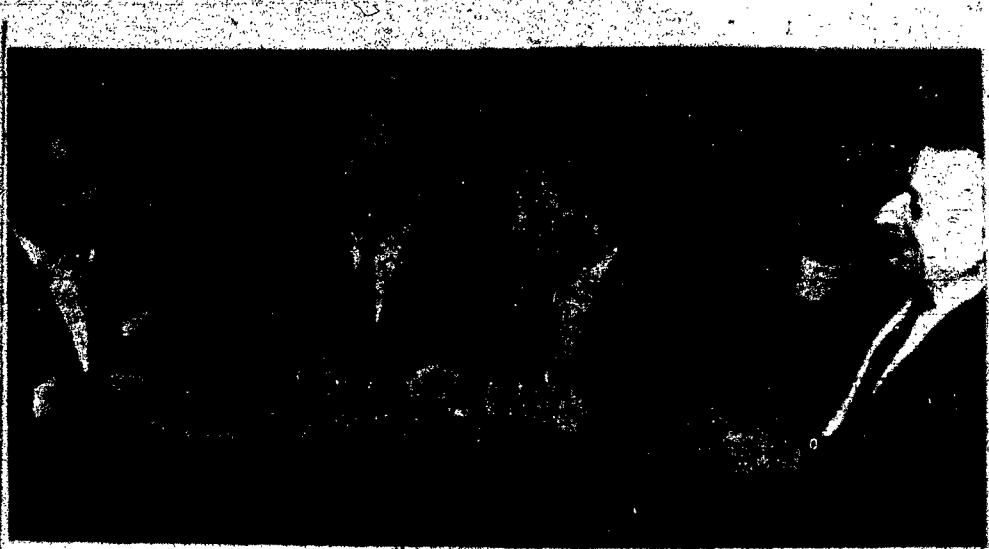
McGara, C.P., Bishop of Youngstown, Ohio, on Thursday, April 28, at St. Michael Monastery Church at Union City, N.J.

A four-day Mission for inmates of Elmira Reformatory will begin in New House Chapel, Sunday, April 24 according to the Don Bosco Bulletin.

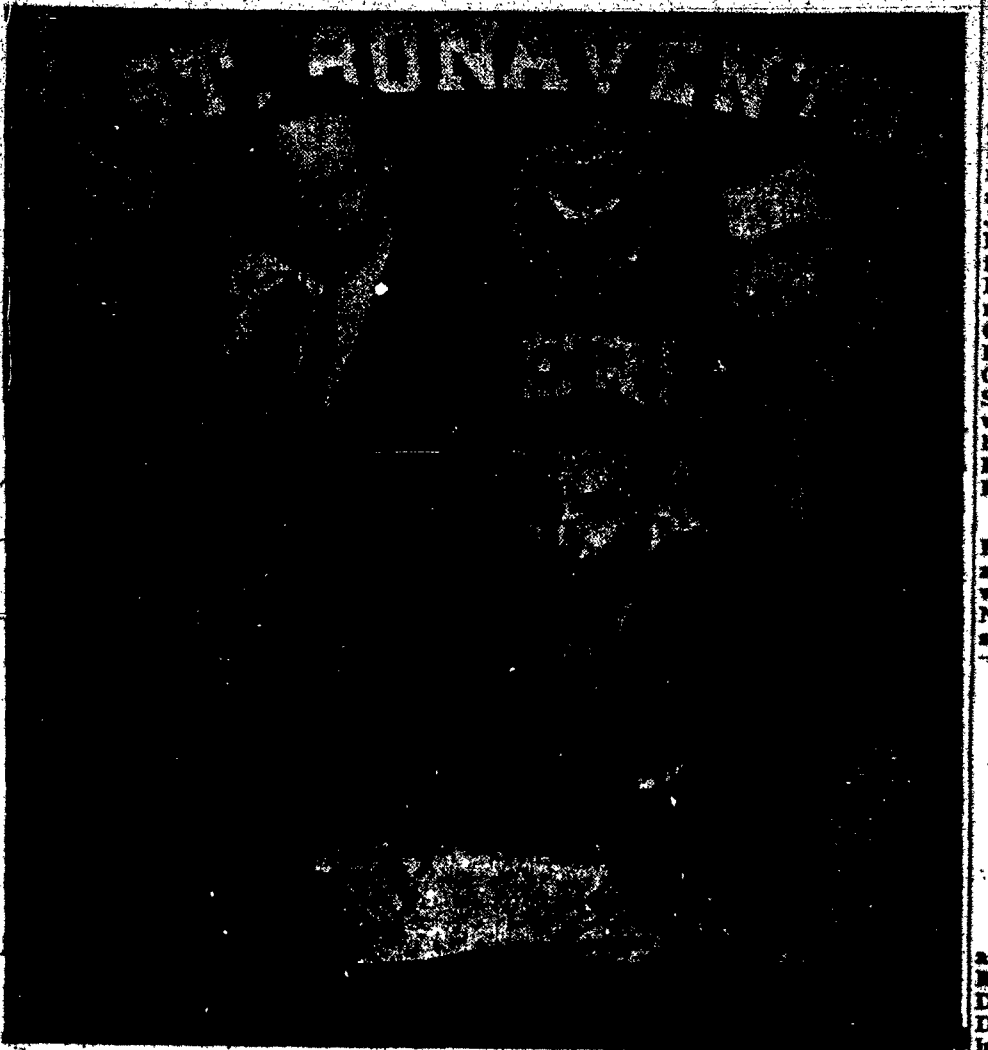
