

Catholic Family Service today entered an appeal for donations toward clothing for First Communion and Confirmation.

"The United Fund Budget is not sufficient to meet such needs which also do not fall within the province of the County Department of Public Welfare," according to the Agency's appeal.

"Some years ago, when special funds were available, the Agency made an agreement with the Public Department. This is still in effect and stipulates that the Catholic Family Service will purchase the special clothing for Confirmation and First Holy Communion for any child for whom the family or the Department can not provide."

The Parish organizations and the Ladies of Charity are most generous in their assistance but there are many children, including those in Foster Homes, for whose clothing the Agency must arrange.
