Do favors to men and they will often hate you. Someone has asked: "Why should he hate me? I never did him a favor." The reason benefactors are sometimes despised is because the one who was helped recognizes an obligation and a debt of gratitude which he is unwilling to discharge. Five days before his death, Countess wrote on the fly leaf of a book to Madame Strass: "These are three things which are never forgiven a person: 1. the favors he did us; 2. the evil he did us; 3. the evil which we could not do to him." Paul Claudel, in one of his dramas makes an official of the state ask: "What favor can your Majesty render to one who has done as much?" The King answers: "Only one — ingratitude."

Extreme though this may seem, what was the reaction of the world to the greatest favor ever granted? The gift of Crucifixion? Holding us his cross, Our Lord says: "With these I wounded in the house of those who love Me." Did He not also speak of the tremendous disproportion between the multitude of the blessings He grants and the fewness of the thanks: "Where are the other men?"

Most people say enough prayers. Few ever give enough thanks. Nothing gives us more joy than the thanksgiving sacrifice some of the faithful make for the Propagation of the Faith.
