Basilian Named To Philosophical Executive Council

Rev. Robert G. Miller, C.S.B., Ph. D., professor of philosophy at St. John Fisher College was elected to the Executive Council of the American Catholic Philosophical Association at the 34th annual convention in St. Louis last week. Father Miller has just completed a regular term as associate editor of the Association's quarterly philosophy publication, "The New Scholasticism" and as secretary of the Canadian Philosophical Association.

The Executive Council is charged with the administration of the activities and publications of the Association which numbers more than 800 members, professors of philosophy throughout the United States, Canada and Mexico.

At the Association's convention last week, Father Miller delivered a paper on the contemporary Linguistic Analysis School of Philosophy. The paper, which is to be published shortly, was entitled "Linguistic Analysis and Metaphysics."

Initial research on the paper was done last year by Father Miller at Oxford and Cambridge, centers of Linguistic Analysis movement, under a research fellowship from the Friends of Assumption Foundation.

Mothers Hear Father Lane

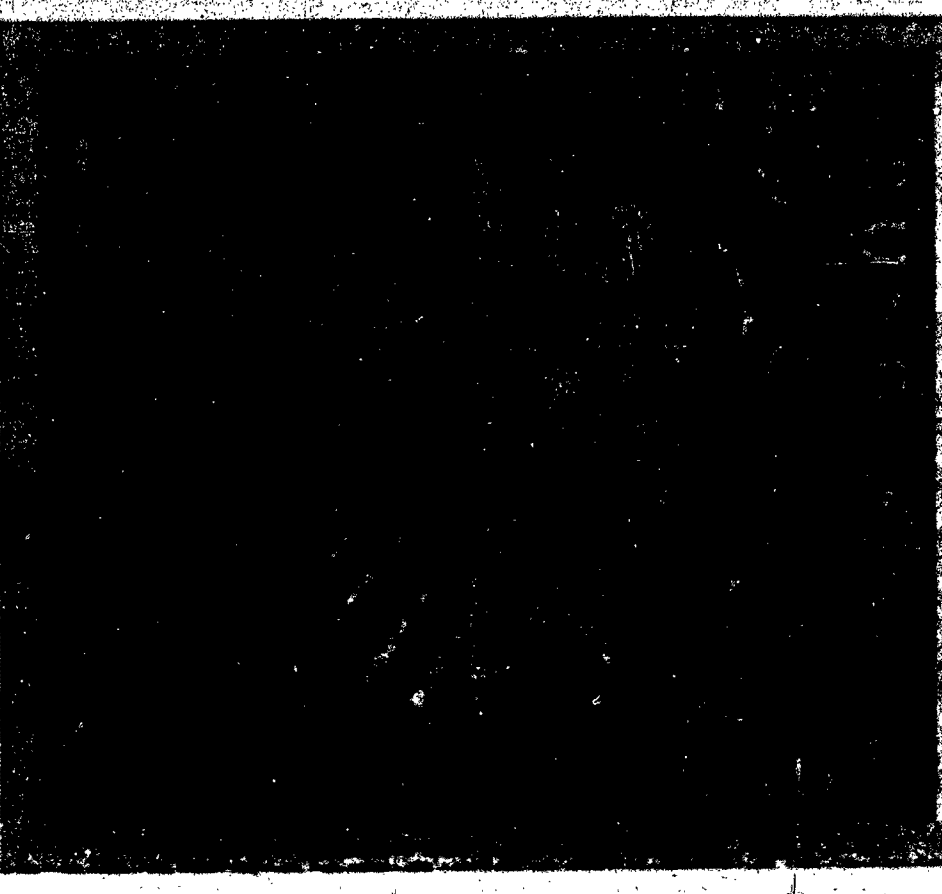
