Theatre News Duel Of Angels

DUEL OF ANGELS—"neither actress, whose every gesture, every pose is important. It was the dancer, Robert Helmsman of the Royal Ballet, whose direction of the play has made every Thursday, Friday and Saturday movement, every angle of the head and body part of a picture. But the play is not nearly as good as its production. At the Helen Hayes Theatre. FROM A TO Z - The invincibility of Miss Hermosa Gingolet's humor: it is in its compelling. In a multiplicity of wigs and makeup, she is as attractively diversified as her revue which hops from sketch to sketch and dance to dance until it is really very difficult to recall the whole alphabet of events on the program so quickly as they elide. One to remember is Elliott Reid when he impersonates a whole political convention with conviction. The longest is "The Sound of Schallu" - a winking name for "The Sound of Music" - in which Miss Gingolet is a nurse from the International Nannies Limited who takes over the Baton von Klappert's family. The setting is smart for the revue, the music, by a number of different composers, is gay and decency is observed but the sketch, with the refrain "A Family Who Drinks Together Stays Together" seemed in dull and dubious taste.
