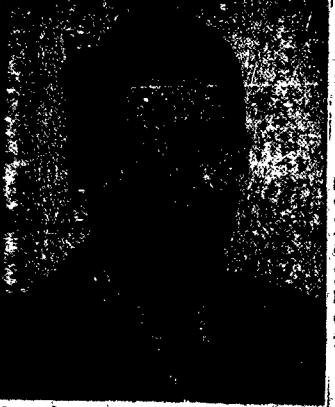

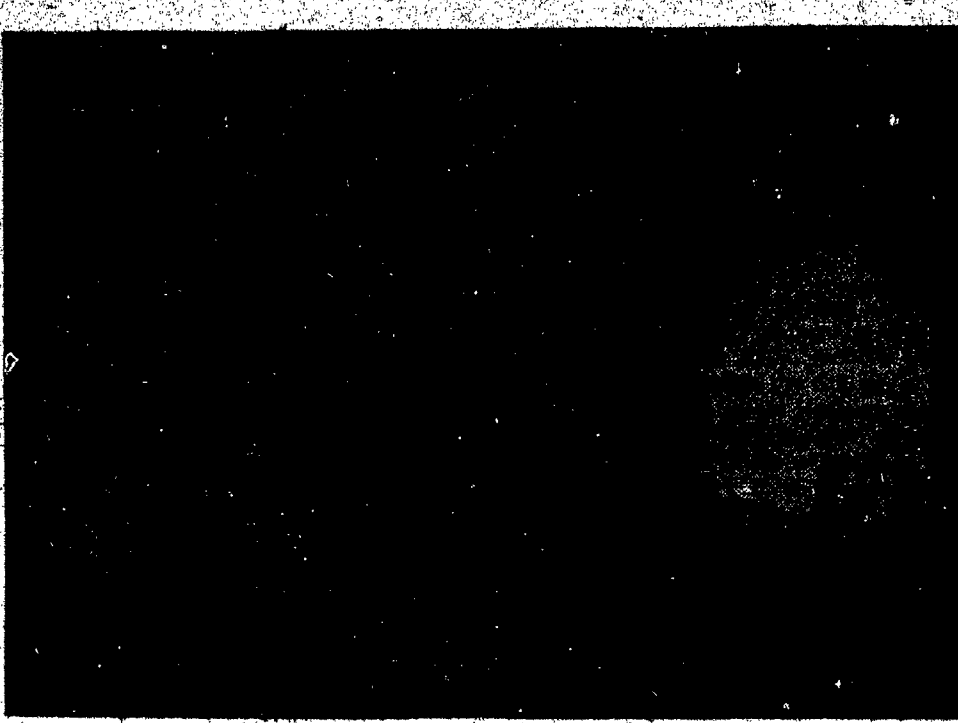
Finals Held For Wrestlers At McQuaid
