Talk It Over Introductions

Dear Miss Culklin: How do you introduce a priest to a woman? Dear Nick: The rule for introducing an ordinary man and woman is that the woman's name is mentioned first. For example, Nick, we would say, "Miss O'Hara this is Mr. Grant." But I don't feel that we Catholics consider a priest an ordinary man. I suggest, therefore, that out of respect a priest's name be mentioned first. We would say, "Father Grant — Miss O'Hara." You will find that there are etiquette books, Nick, that advise the "clergyman's" name be mentioned first only if he is a "high Church dignitary" such as a Cardinal. But, appreciating as we do what the priesthood represents, I don't feel that any woman would expect to have a priest presented to her; she should always be presented to the priest.

Dear Mrs. J.: Well-bred persons attending a concert or any other artistic performance will give consideration to the artist even when they are not particularly impressed with his talents. In summary, this is what they will do:

1. They will be seated before the artist begins performing.
2. They will keep their eyes on the performer at an indication of their interest. This they will continue to do even though there might be some distraction in the theatre. Never will they turn around to investigate the cause. Neither will they rattle programs, squirm in their seats nor will they whisper to any person seated beside them.
3. They will not applaud until they are certain the performer is ready for it. When the artist is prepared to welcome audience appreciation, he will usually indicate it by expression, pause, or a slight bow.
