Off The Record

I Love Paris

Michael Legrand, outstanding arranger, conductor and pianist, has ventured backward and recorded an album with which he has already had splendid success. The original "I Love Paris" album was recorded with full orchestra arranged and conducted by Michel Legrand. This new album of "I Love Paris" features Legrand at the piano backed by rhythm trio.

Using the very same tunes which appeared in the first album, Legrand has arranged the music with a brilliant new approach drawing heavily on the jazz form. Yet it is no less French nor less romantic than before. Michel Legrand is a traveler, an enthusiastic admirer of modern music of all kinds and a splendid pianist. As a result, his playing and arranging reflect his absorption with contemporary jazz and his artistry as an arranger and performer.

To redo an album which has already enjoyed success takes a lot of daring, invention and wit. Legrand has all of these. This album of music about Paris contains all sorts of moods, just as Paris itself reflects a great number of moods. The tune "I Love Paris" is played with a light swing. "Autumn Leaves" is a tragic, and reflective mood.

"Under The Bridge Of Paris" is presented with a rhythmic speed. "Paris In The Spring" and "Paris Canaille" are done briskly and followed by the rhapsodic "April In Paris." Then there is the easy-going "La Vie En Rose," a lilting waltz rendition of "Under Paris Skies" and the young and gay spirit of "The Last Time I Saw Paris."

The album winds up with impressive variations of "The Song From Moulin Rouge" and "I Love Paris." Michel Legrand is one of the most brilliant young musicians of our time. Here is a fellow who can draw on jazz, classic, folk and foreign music, arrange it his own way and it comes out a whole new form of music — called "Legrand."

FOR THE ever-lovin' Dixie-land lovers, here's a nice new toe-tapper. "Dixie In Hi Society" by Barney Richards and his Rebels, on Mercury label, Barney has selected tunes which are not usually performed in Dixieland fashion, such as "Oh Lady Be Good," "Thou Swell," "Someone To Watch Ove Me," "Just In Time" and "C'est Magnifique."

He also added a few definite Dixie tunes such as "Bill Bailey" and "Mourning Blues." But the combination is fine, the arrangements are inventive without losing the real Dixie flavor and New Orleans influence definitely pervades the entire album.

FOR THOSE who flip over the big hits of the past or present, here is an album containing several big windings of the past few years performed by the original artists who made a million on records which sold over a million. The album is called "More Golden Goodies." This is really a follow-up to the previous album "Golden Goodies."

A hit song, even if it does not last very long on the charts, remains in the minds of the public as something which was good, big, interesting, and entertaining at the time. Many record companies have recently put together albums of the big hits in an effort to cash in a second time, on material which has proven itself worthy of public consumption.

This is not a bad idea. If a thing is good once, it should be good a second time around. So here is an album of goodies which should delight the heart, if one is nostalgic enough to reminisce or bold enough to try it again. "More Golden Goodies" is an album (one of several) which should delight the nostalgic heart.

Included in this collection of dollar-signs are: "Sugar Blues" by Clyde McCoy; "Misty" by Erroll Garner; "Night Train" by Buddy Morrow; "Caravan" by Duke Ellington; "Tutti" by Richard Hayman; "Fog On My Heart" by the Harmonicats; "Melody Of Love" by David Carroll and "Mistlou" by Jan August. Actually, the idea of buying a album containing hit songs is a good one.

Glee Clubs Set Joint Concert

The Glee Club of McQuaid Jesuit High School will play host today, May 6, to the Glee Clubs of Mercy High School and St. Agnes High, in a concert of voice, piano, and band music.

The program to be held at McQuaid, will feature several numbers by the glee clubs of Mercy and St. Agnes in addition to the concert planned by the host glee club. Rev. William H. McBride, S.J., director of the McQuaid songmen, has included in the bill of the night "Begin the Beguine" among 13 numbers covering a wide range of musical interest.

Damien DeMasi, student accompanist for the group, will take the spotlight at the piano with Manuel de Falla's "Ritual Fire Dance" and the "Clog Dance" by Howard Hanson. Among the selections of the guest glee clubs will be a medley of songs from "South Pacific," sung by the Mercy Glee Club under the direction of Sister Mary Leo. St. Agnes Glee Club, directed by Sister Joseph Eileen, will include "The Battle Hymn of the Republic" and Mozart's "Alleluia."

The McQuaid Band, under the direction of Mr. Giacomo Achille, will play several selections. The concert, open to the public, will be followed by a record hop in the school cafeteria.
