Tender flaked coconut and a simple frosting combine to "package" this lovely cake for Mother—the key effect is charming—add with a real flower on top, here's a gift you can be proud of.

For those who wish to make a deliciously flavored and tinted frosting, here is a special recipe. It is a special recipe, a butter frosting, ripe; but for younger, inexperienced may be still easier. However for the pretty packaging effect, be sure to tint whatever frosting you use with a drop or so of food coloring.

MOTHER'S DAY CAKE
1 package banana cake mix
1 can Angel Flake Coconut
Coconut Paste Frosting

Prepare and bake cake in 9x9x2 inch pan. Frost, then decorate as follows: Sprinkle flaked coconut in strips to resemble ribbon. Outline "ribbons" in bright jelly. You can melt jelly slightly and using the tip of a spoon drizzle on the jelly or an aster way it is to buy one of the tubes of decorating jelly.

They come in various colors and all you need to do is to press the tube and the jelly comes out in a fine stream. These tubes are new on the market and are especially nice when writing on cakes. Sprinkle coconut thickly on sides of cake while frosting is still soft. Place an orchid, carnation or other flower corsage in center.

*Coconut Paste Frosting
Mix 3/4 c. tart current jelly, 1 unbeaten egg, white 3/4 c. sugar, dash of salt in top of double boiler. Place over boiling water and beat with sturdy

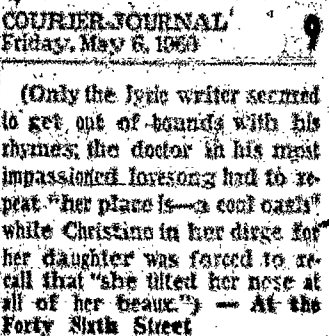
